## **Village Receives Community Planning Grant**

The Village of Algonquin received a \$90,000 Community Planning Program grant from the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP) to hire a consultant to prepare a strategic action plan for enhancing Downtown Algonquin as a walk-

able, mixed-use business district. In particular, the plan will help the village understand what land use, economic development, access/circulation, open space, and aesthetic improvement opportunities exist downtown as a result of the Illinois Route 31 Algonquin Western Bypass. The planning process will conclude with a final study report that will outline a series of recommended downtown improvement priorities.

The Algonquin Downtown Planning Study will offer several opportunities for public input, the first of which is a 10-minute online survey that residents are encouraged to take on the village's website www.algonquin.org through mid-April. ## **E-Waste Recycling Event**

The Village of Algonquin will hold an E-Waste Recycling Event on May 5 between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. Bring your unwanted qualifying electronics to the Algonquin Public Works Facility, 110 Meyer Drive. This event will be open to all Village of Algonquin residents.

Electronics that qualify for this event and will be taken at no charge include desktop PCs, laptop PCs, monitors (CRT & LCD), keyboards, mice, cords, cables (power, USB, etc.), hard drives, miscellaneous computer components, CD-ROM drives, zip drives, tape drives, printers, televisions, console televisions, VCRs, DVD players, handheld electronic organizers, handheld games, video game players, joysticks/games controls, cameras (film and digital), camcorders, radios, stereos, portable CD players, typewriters, word processors, fax machines, scanners, telephones, microwaves, toasters, and pagers. Items that are NOT included in this recycling effort include, but are not limited to: white goods (refrigerators, stoves, freezers, dishwashers, dryers, air conditioner units, and other appliances labeled as such), medical waste products, household and vehicle batteries, curling irons, and rubber-based items.

## **Spring Cleanup**

In April, the Village, along with Waste Management, will sponsor a Village-wide cleanup program for single-family residences and townhomes that currently receive residential refuse and recycling services. This program is to encourage residents to reduce fire hazards in their homes and to "spruce up" their neighborhoods. STICKERS ARE NOT REQUIRED FOR THIS SPECIAL PICKUP. Typical items to be discarded include toys, old clothes, couches, beds, dressers, grills, and patio furniture. #### Free Leaf & Brush Collection

Waste Management will provide free collection of leaves and branches (tied in bundles which are not more than 4 feet in length and 2 feet in diameter) April 2 - April 27. Leaves must be placed in standard paper yardwaste bags or reusable containers that are clearly marked with a red "X." Place the bags or cans at the curb on your regular collection day. Leaves placed in loose piles will NOT be collected.

Grass clippings and other yardwaste will still require a collection sticker. Any bags or cans that contain leaves mixed with other yardwaste will also require a collection sticker. The stickers for garbage and yardwaste are interchangeable. Please contact Waste Management at 800-796-9696 with questions regarding leaf and brush collection.

### **Cemetery Cleanup**

The annual "Spring Cleanup" of the Algonquin Cemetery will be the week of April 2. All winter decorations, such as blankets and wreaths, and other decorations that are not removed before April 1 will be discarded.

Spring decorations may be placed on graves beginning April 7. Mother's Day and/or summer decorations may be placed on graves beginning May 1. Remember, no planting may be done in Blocks 8 or 9 of the cemetery. No planting of bushes or shrubs, etc. may be done in any part of the cemetery except by authority of the Village of Algonquin.
