<u>COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE</u> ~ Trustee Schmitt gave his report for the committee meeting of May 23rd with minutes forthcoming. Action was taken during tonight's Omnibus Agenda

<u>GENERAL ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE</u>~ Trustee Steigert reported the committee has not met since the last Board meeting.

<u>PUBLIC WORKS & SAFETY COMMITTEE</u> \sim Trustee Smith gave his report for the committee that met June 1st with minutes forthcoming. The following action is required at this time.

1. Moved by Smith, seconded by Schmitt, to award the bid for Riverfront Park reconstruction to V3 Construction Group of Oak Brook, IL in the amount of \$658,064.14.

During discussion, Trustee Donner stated that although the project is worthy she was concerned about it being \$100,000. over bid estimate. Trustee Smith said that the project has been bided twice and this is the lowest bid of the lot. Trustee Schmitt said there was earthwork required that was found after estimates. Following discussion, a roll call vote was taken.

Roll Call; voting aye – Smith, Schmitt, Wolski, Steigert. Voting nay – Donner. Motion carried; 4-ayes, 1-nay, 1-absent.

2. Moved by Smith, seconded by Wolski, to allow use of a pony in Towne Park by Rachel Martinez on June 17th for a birthday party.

Roll Call; voting aye – Smith, Schmitt, Wolski, Steigert, Donner.

Motion carried; 5-ayes, 0-nays, 1-absent.

<u>COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE</u> ~ President Spella reported his committee did not meet in May.

<u>VILLAGE CLERK</u> ~ Clerk Kautz announced upcoming scheduled Village meetings.

STAFF REPORTS:

VILLAGE MANAGER ~ Mr. Ganek reported the following:

Eight to ten percent of the annual budget is coming from various grants with several major projects benefiting from such grants.

PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR ~ Mr. Mitchard reported the following:

Working on Tunbridge Pond doing a final inspection with things looking very well. Also working with various developers that do not have final road surface work completed and stating to do so as soon as possible. Harnish Drive work will continue.

The Planning & Zoning Commission has (3) items on it's agenda for next week. One being the Colman Conference Center. His department is working on the Downtown Revitalization project.

Huntington Drive surface transportation project review is now completed. Harper Drive culvert preconstruction meeting was held last week. Plans are complete for Algonquin Shores piping work.
