MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING

OF THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF ALGONQUIN, McHENRY & KANE COUNTIES, IL HELD IN VILLAGE HALL ON SEPTEMBER 4, 2001

<u>CALL TO ORDER</u>: Village President Ted Spella called the regular meeting to order at 8:00 PM. Village Clerk Jerry Kautz Clerk called the roll.

ROLL CALL: Present: Trustees Jim Steigert, Barbara Read, Linda Wolski, Bob Smith, Constance Donner. Absent: John Schmitt. A quorum was established.

Staff in attendance: Administration – William Ganek, Robert Mitchard, Jeff Mihelich, Russell Laine. Attorney – H. David Rogers, Engineer – Frank Cuda.

PLEDGE TO FLAG: Clerk Kautz led all present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

ADOPT AGENDA: Moved by Donner, seconded by Wolski, to adopt tonight's agenda as printed including Item 15, Executive session to discuss possible property acquisition, and threatened litigation.

Voice vote; ayes carried.

PROCLAMATION: Clerk Kautz read a proclamation stating the month of October as Pediatric Cancer Awareness Month.

AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION:

- 1. Ralph Hansen, 729 N. River Road, Algonquin, stated he is concerned about the N. River Road construction.
- 2. Scott Hansen, 727 N. River Road, voiced concern regarding speeding vehicles on River Road and the danger to children and other residents. He said he believes a wider road of 24 feet will be more dangerous and wants the Village to leave the road narrow. He also said police should be enforcing the speed limits.
- 3. Merle Patterson, 721 N. River Road, said he sent a letter to the Village Manager and asked if it is being addressed. Mr. Ganek acknowledged it was received and reviewed by staff and will be discussed with the full Board of Trustees.
- 4. Irving Braun, 715 N. River Road, complained that he is not able to exit his driveway properly do to his neighbor's driveway having cars parked close to the road and now the possibility of having the road in front his neighbor's property being narrowed to 22 feet instead of 24 as planned. He is also worried about speeding traffic.
- 5. Florence Kruk, 301 N. River Road, asked if a sidewalk can be installed on the north side of Route 62, east of N. River Road to allow pedestrian traffic access to the seniors' complex. Mr. Ganek stated that a sidewalk would be installed when the land is developed which is not planned soon. She also inquired what is a "pleasure driveway". Again, Mr. Ganek stated that in order for a municipality to create a pleasure driveway, which gives the Village the authority to lower speed limits on its own and do other safety measures, it would take two thirds of the affected property owners to approve. The consensus of the N. River Road property owners is to <u>not</u> sign the petition.

The grade for Cornish Park was cut six inches and is being prepared for a green space. Holder Park Playground construction is being completed. Recruiting for open positions within the department. The 50/50 sidewalk program is in progress. Grading for a 40 acre site near the new library is beginning.
