<u>CALL TO ORDER</u>: Village President Ted Spella called the regular meeting to order at 8:46 PM. Village Clerk Jerry Kautz called the roll.

PLEDGE TO FLAG: Clerk Kautz led all present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

VILLAGE CLERK ~ Clerk Kautz announced upcoming scheduled Village meetings.

STAFF REPORTS:

VILLAGE MANAGER ~ Mr. Ganek reported the following:

He thanked those who attended the dedication of Riverfront Park. He also reported his time has been spent on collective bargaining.

PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR ~ Mr. Mitchard reported the following:

Most of his time has been used on collective bargaining and several development plan reviews.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DIRECTOR ~ Mr. Mihelich reported the following:

The Community Development Committee will discuss two items on the agenda, including Briarwood Plaza development, and the proposed Kristensen building on South Main Street. He also reported that the Panera Bread Restaurant is opening this week.

VILLAGE ENGINEER ~ Mr. Cuda reported the following:

They are reviewing 21 sets of plans for the Wastewater Treatment Plant Phase 5D, with a bid opening on November 29. This will conclude the Phase 5 upgrades. He also has reviewed several development design plans.

<u>POLICE CHIEF</u> ~ Chief Laine reported the following:

He announced this years Christmas Parade will be held December 1, and also the official tree lighting. He is also working on collective bargaining issues. The Deputy Chiefs have attended Homeland Security meetings, and he has attended meetings with the F.B.I. and Governor Ridge, Director of Homeland Security.

VILLAGE ATTORNEY ~ Mr. Rogers reported the following:

His office has been involved with contract reviews, ordinance reviews, and collective bargaining issues.

CORRESPONDENCE & MISCELLANEOUS:

1. Trustee Schmitt received a letter from a resident requesting additional stop signs on Stonegate Drive. This will be placed on the next Public Works & Safety Committee agenda.

OLD BUSINESS:

1. Trustee Donner placed a matter before the Board for discussion. She was very upset at a recent news article in which President Spella was allegedly berated by County Board Member, Dan Shea, for a letter he sent to McHenry County on behalf of the Village of Algonquin regarding the Village's access agreement signed in 1993 by the county and other municipalities concerning curb cuts on Randall Road. The County passed an ordinance in 1997 that they felt was more restrictive in

accessing county roads and did not notify the municipalities affected. Attorney Rogers stated it is his opinion that the agreement supercedes the ordinance. Trustee Donner asked the Board to consider a resolution from the Village to McHenry County in strong support of the original agreement. After further discussion the following resolution was brought up for Board approval.

Moved by Steigert, seconded by Donner, to adopt <u>RESOLUTION 2001-R-18, CONFIRMING</u>

THE VILLAGE OF ALGONQUIN'S SUPPORT FOR THE 1993 RANDALL ROAD ACCESS

AGREEMENT AND URGING MCHENRY COUNTY TO MAINTAIN ITS

PARTICIPATION AND SUPPORT

Roll call vote; voting aye – Steigert, Smith, Read, Schmitt, Donner, Wolski. Motion carried; 6-ayes, 0-nays.
