Longmeadow Parkway Bridge Corridor opens.

The Longmeadow Parkway Bridge Corridor is now open. The new toll-free bridge, which carries commuters over the Fox River, is the centerpiece of the 5.6-mile road that stretches from Huntley Road to IL Route 62 in the northern section of Kane County. It took collaboration from 11 villages, 3 counties, the state and federal government to build Longmeadow Parkway. The parkway creates a vital artery that connects our communities, enhances regional mobility, and drives economic growth.

Mineral Springs restored.

The Algonquin Garden Club and the Algonquin Historic Commission secured \$22,500 for the restoration of the Mineral Springs site in Towne Park.

The Mineral Springs site, which is located on the south banks of Crystal Creek near Jefferson Street in Towne Park, was one of the most popular artesian wells along the Algonquin river bluffs dating back to the original settlement of the area. Work to restore the original concrete at the site and install interpretative signage was completed.

Art on the Fox returns to downtown Main Street.

The September fest showcases the work of 75+ of the nation's top juried artists, along with live musical performances and familyfriendly activities including sand art, face painting, a graffiti wall, and an interactive kid's art tent. There is something for everyone, from great art and food, to the wonderful stores and restaurants in our community.



Tree City USA awarded.

The Arbor Day Foundation announced that the Village of Algonquin is again named a Tree City USA community for its commitment to urban forestry. This is the 28th year in which Algonquin has received this designation. The Village is responsible for the maintenance of over 21,000 parkway trees.

The Government Finance Officers Association's Triple Crown recognizes governments who have received GFOA's Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting, Popular Annual Financial Reporting Award, and the Distinguished Budget Presentation Award. The Village was one of a handful of local governments in the nation to receive this distinguished recognition.

Major park improvements made.

The Village reached significant milestones in its ongoing commitment to enhance recreational amenities and the quality of life for all Algonquin residents.

James B. Wood Park upgrades feature a new playground, basketball court, and pavilion. The nature-themed playground has been designed to be inclusive, ensuring that children of all abilities can play and enjoy together.

Holder Park features brand-new playground equipment, a refurbished baseball backstop and fencing and an updated basketball court. The playground has been transformed into a modern area for children featuring a firstresponder theme. Holder Park is named in honor of Algonquin Police Officer Larry Holder, who tragically lost his life in 1982.



Towne Park improvements include a large, inclusive playground, an embankment play area, picnic shelter, looped trail with accessible connection to all improvements, a renovated restroom building, a new restroom building and picnic shelter, a new bandshell, and a river-walk connection.

Presidential Park improvements include a new sports-themed playground, updated challenge course and fitness equipment, improved multi-use and soccer fields, and an upgraded open-air pavilion with restroom facilities.

Willoughby Farms Park Master Plan underway.

The Village has begun the process of developing a plan to update the facilities and amenities at Willoughby Farms Park. The 12-acre community park currently features a playground, baseball diamond, basketball court (which converts to a seasonal ice-skating rink), and tennis/pickleball.

Form of Government

The Village of Algonquin is formally organized under the Trustee-Village form of government and combines the strong political leadership of elected officials (in the form of the Village Board) with the professional experiences of an appointed local government administrator. The Board consists of a President, six Trustees, and a Village Clerk, elected at large to serve overlapping four-year terms. The Board appoints the Village Manager to carry out its directives and oversee the delivery of public services. The Village Manager also supervises the daily operations of the Village and all of its departments.

In 1995, the Board passed an ordinance that modeled the Village's government after the Council-Manager form. According to the Illinois City/County Management Association, "Under the council-manager form, power is concentrated in the elected council, which hires a professional administrator to implement its policies. This appointee serves at the pleasure of the council and has responsibility for preparing the budget, directing day-to-day operations, personnel staffing changes, and serving as the council's chief policy advisor."

During a storm event, streams need room to swell in size and change shape within the floodplain in response to the intensity of the storm. Naturally vegetated riparian areas reduce the force, height and volume of stormwater by allowing it to spread out horizontally thereby lessening the severity of impacts downstream. Water that floods into vegetated floodplains re-enters the main stream channel slowly, enabling it to be soaked up by the moist spongy layers in the riparian zone. Such vegetation also intercepts and detains runoff from adjacent upland areas that would otherwise directly flow into streams and exacerbate flooding conditions.

WATER SYSTEM STATUS

Grafton Township

Check signs posted throughout town, check the Village's website (www.algonquin.org), or call 847-658-2700 to check the current water status. Status regulations are as follows:

CONSERVATION: Green signs indicate outside water use is permitted except for watering landscaping and lawns, which is prohibited between the hours of 9:00 am and 6:00 pm.

EVEN/ODD: Yellow signs indicate even/odd days for watering before 9:00 am and after 6:00 pm. Even addresses may only water on even calendar days and odd addresses may only water on odd calendar days, before 9:00 am and after 6:00 pm.

EVENODO 6:00-9:00 AME Orange signs indicate even/odd days for watering only between the hours of 6:00 am and 9:00 am. Even addresses may only water on even calendar days and odd addresses may only water on odd calendar days from 6:00 am to 9:00 am.

RESTRICTED Red signs indicate no outside water is allowed at any time. This includes all use of water outside, such as washing vehicles, power washing, and watering landscaping.

The Village has a zero tolerance policy for illegal watering and tickets will be issued for illegal watering.
