#### MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING

# OF THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF ALGONQUIN, McHENRY & KANE COUNTIES, IL HELD IN VILLAGE HALL ON JANUARY 7, 2003

<u>CALL TO ORDER</u>: Acting Village President John Schmitt called the regular meeting to order at 8:20 PM. Village Clerk Jerry Kautz Clerk called the roll.

**ROLL CALL:** Present: Trustees Jim Steigert, Barbara Read, Linda Wolski, Bob Smith, Constance

Donner, John Schmitt. A quorum was established. Staff in attendance: Administration – William Ganek, Bob Mitchard, Jeff Mihelich, Russell Laine. Attorney – H. David Rogers, Engineer – Frank Cuda.

**PLEDGE TO FLAG:** Clerk Kautz led all present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

**ADOPT AGENDA:** Moved by Schmitt, seconded by Wolski, to adopt tonight's agenda as printed. Voice vote; ayes carried.

## **AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION:**

- 1. Nancie Watkins, 815 Birch, Algonquin, voiced concern and requested relief to the current water pressure problems in her neighborhood known as Scenic Ridge.
- 2. Kevin Hammersmith, 321 Hillcrest, Algonquin, also voiced his concerns for the record regarding the water problems in Scenic Ridge. He especially is worried about the lack of water pressure at the local fire hydrants and the safety issues involved.
- 3. Jane Melle, 434 Hillcrest, Algonquin, requested a permanent solution to the water pressure problems in her area and was concerned that money is being used for other projects such as streets and not for water. Mr. Ganek replied that other road projects are funded by MFT funds that can only be used for streets and roads. Water & Sewer funding is limited to revenue from user fees. Mr. Schmitt added, as a result of last summer's water events, the Village has allocated \$83,000. which is in progress.
- 4. Jerry Glogowski, 730 Butterfield, Algonquin, asked what is happening with the warning signs for the Western By-pass Corridor. Mr. Ganek stated that McHenry County has told him that they are working on a formal response to the request. The County may not feel it is appropriate to post signs until the environmental studies are completed. On another matter, Mr. Glogowski asked about the continuation of Longmeadow Parkway to Route 31. Mr. Ganek responded by saying that portion of the road is outside the Village jurisdiction at this time and it is Kane County's responsibility. He did add that all residents bordering the Longmeadow Parkway had to sign a Letter of Awareness when they purchased their homes along the finished portion.
