MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING

OF THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF ALGONQUIN, McHENRY & KANE COUNTIES, IL HELD IN VILLAGE HALL ON SEPTEMBER 2, 2003

<u>CALL TO ORDER</u>: Acting Village President John Schmitt called the regular meeting to order at 8:00 PM. Village Clerk Jerry Kautz Clerk called the roll.

ROLL CALL: Present: Trustees Jim Steigert, Barbara Read, Constance Donner, Robert Smith, John Spella. A quorum was established.

Staff in attendance: Administration – William Ganek, Michele Zimmermann, Jeff Mihelich, Russell Laine. Attorney – Dave Rogers, Engineer – Frank Cuda.

PLEDGE TO FLAG: Clerk Kautz led all present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

ADOPT AGENDA: Moved by Schmitt, seconded by Read, to adopt tonight's agenda as printed, deleting items 11C-1, Intergovernmental Agreement, and 16, Executive Session. Voice vote; ayes carried.

RECOGNIZING ALGONQUIN POLICE EXPLORERS: The Algonquin Police Explorers Post 104, presented to Chief Laine, a first place trophy that the Post won during a State competition for firearms simulation. In addition, Mr. Kevin Meyers, Founders Days President, presented a check to the explorers for their various work during the festival this past July. Officer Rob Salazar was introduced as the Explorers Post sponsor.

AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION:

1. Jerry Glogowski, 730 Butterfield, Algonquin, praised the future Algonquin Commons Retail Center as a boom for the Village, but voiced concern about traffic control as this is a very large project. Mr. Mihelich responded, the Developer has to improve the road to three lanes in both directions with signals and cannot open the Center until the improvements are completed.

Street patching is taking place on the west side. The new Public Works facility parking lot is finished with some landscaping taking place.

The Plan Commission has several items on its agenda for next week including plans for a new Krispy Kreme site in front of the Target store. Kohl's plans to be open on October 1. The Economic Development Commission will be discussing new Business Awards.

Algonquin Hills Phase 3 decorative work is being completed. The Gaslight project is also being finished.
