The SEECOM Project is under construction with equipment ordered for June delivery. SEECOM has hired all of Algonquin's telecommunicators. The Village has received a \$400,000. grant for Ted Spella Park development. There will be several phases of the 150 acre park.

PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR ~ Mr. Mitchard reported the following:

Spring clean-up activities are continuing in parks, streets, and recreation facilities. Staff is also doing a litter policing project on Randall Road. Bid opening for the South Algonquin Project Phase 3 will take place this week. A pre-construction meeting for Alta Vista Rehab Project will take place soon. The North Harrison Street project continues.

<u>COMMUNITY PLANNING DIRECTOR</u> ~ Mr. Mihelich reported the following:

Chili's Restaurant opens this Thursday. The Plan & Zoning Commission will discuss the final phase of Terrace Lakes Subdivision, and Corporate Center review.

<u>VILLAGE ENGINEER</u> ~ Mr. Cuda reported the following:

Circle Drive construction will continue after winter. the E.P.A. has approved plans for the southwest Sanitary Sewer Interceptor. The new water tank on Square Barn will be ready soon.

POLICE DEPARTMENT ~ Chief Laine reported the following:

D.A.R.E. graduations will take place at the following schools; St Margaret Mary on April 13. St John's has been postponed to a later date. Sixty two persons attended a recent Retail Theft Prevention meeting hosted by the Department.
