

OF THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF ALGONQUIN, McHENRY & KANE COUNTIES, IL HELD IN VILLAGE HALL ON APRIL 19, 2005

<u>CALL TO ORDER</u>: Acting Village President John Schmitt called the regular meeting to order at 8:00 PM. Village Clerk Jerry Kautz called the roll.

ROLL CALL: Present: Trustees Constance Donner, Robert Smith, John Spella, John Schmitt, Barbara Read, Jim Steigert. A quorum was established.

Staff in attendance: Administration – William Ganek, Robert Mitchard, Jeff Mihelich, Jenna Kollings, Russ Laine. Attorney – Dave Rogers, Engineer – Frank Cuda.

PLEDGE TO FLAG: Village Clerk Kautz led all present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

<u>ADOPT AGENDA</u>: Moved by Smith, seconded by Read, to adopt tonight's agenda as printed, deleting item 16, Executive Session.

Voice vote; ayes carried.

PROCLAMATION: Trustee Read read a proclamation proclaiming May 1 through May 7 as Municipal Clerk's week in Algonquin. Village Clerk Kautz thanked the Board and praised his Deputy Clerk, Jenna Kollings for all her assistance over the past year.

AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION:

- 1. Virginia Peeples, 1112 Sawmill Lane, Algonquin, voiced concern about the upcoming summer watering hours. She wishes to water her flowers anytime and feels it would be detrimental to her plants not being able to water them daily. Acting President Schmitt told her that wells are being prepared for start up in July which will increase water production by 30%. She then said she would use a sprinkling can instead of a hose.
- 2. Karen Schafer, 3 Rock River Court, and Carol Austin, 12 Rock River Court, Algonquin, voiced complaint about the wetlands being flooded behind Karen's home and she may lose some trees. Mrs. Schafer said they were told by a beaver trapper that the water is polluted with two dangerous bacteria, and children and pets should not go in or near the pond. Public works Director Mitchard replied that the beaver trapper that was originally hired by the Village was told by the staff to remove the traps as neighbors said they did not want the beavers harmed. Some damns are good for the wetland and greenbelt corridor, but a few would have to be removed if flooding occurs. As for the bacteria, Mr. Mitchard stated his staff will look into the matter but this type of bacteria is not usually found in this area.
- 3. Jim Ranallo, 635 Clearview Court, Algonquin, said, in response to Ms. Peeples' comments, if he has to choose between nice green lawns this summer or having enough water to shower and domestic use, he will take the latter. He asked if paving will continue in High Hill Farms Subdivision. Mr. Mitchard responded that the construction began on April 4 but some equipment broke down. It will be up and running soon and he read a schedule of streets to be done. Mr. Ranallo then expounded on how he travels throughout the Village doing his job and that he is upset with a lot of deserted cars and trucks parked in driveways with some vehicles blocking sidewalks. He said he did not to see the Village becoming "slummy". Mr. Schmitt took exception to his comments saying the village staff will do what is necessary to see that residents adhere to our ordinances.
