

<u>CALL TO ORDER</u>: Village President John Schmitt brought the regular meeting to order at 8:00 PM. Village Clerk Jerry Kautz called the roll.

ROLL CALL: Present: Trustees John Spella, Robert Smith, Jerrold Glogowski, Jim Steigert, Brian Dianis, Barbara Read. A quorum was established.

Staff in attendance: Administration – William Ganek, Robert Mitchard, Jeff Mihelich, Russ Laine. Attorney – Kelly Cahill, Engineer – Frank Cuda.

PLEDGE TO FLAG: Village Clerk Kautz led all present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

<u>ADOPT AGENDA</u>: Moved by Smith, seconded by Spella, to adopt tonight's agenda as printed, including item 15, Executive Session to discuss property acquisition. Voice vote; ayes carried.

AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION:

- 1. John Macko, 1671 Stonegate, Algonquin, asked what the Village's long range plan for future water supply. Mr. Ganek responded saying seven wells are in place but the aquifer is dropping due to dry conditions. Eight million dollars are being spent to upgrade and expand the entire system with a new water treatment plant scheduled to begin soon. The filter supplier (private company) has not shipped as expected and will forfeit any early shipment bonuses in the contract. A deep well is being planned and will add four million gallons per day to the system. The shallow wells have not been able to keep up with demand and that is why we are in a "RED" condition. President Schmitt hopes we can go to yellow condition soon but it depends on the aquifer levels. Surrounding villages share the same aquifers as Algonquin. Also fines are levied for residential use over 18,000 gallons per month as the average household uses 6,000 gallons.
- 2. Louis Borntrager, 1411 Notting Hill Road, Algonquin, also addressed the water situation. He wanted to know why Algonquin is the only community in the area that has a RED (no outside watering) edict. He is concerned about property values dropping because landscaping would dry up. He was reminded that residents can use buckets or sprinkling cans to hand water plants, shrubs, and trees, just no sprinkling or handheld hose use. At this point, Mr. Steigert interjected that Algonquin has been very prudent in protecting this natural resource and does not know why other communities don't as he can not speak for them. Mr. Smith agreed.
- 3. John Wilson, 1420 Notting Hill Road, Algonquin, voiced concern about all the development of commercial business and their use of water. He wants the Board to consider restricting water usage of car washes, fitness centers, and restaurants. Mr. Ganek responded that the Village will not "put local companies out of business". The pay large tap fees and their taxes help build the water system.

- 2. Moved by Steigert, seconded by Read, to approve and award the bid for Well #15 Raw Water Transmission Main to Elmwood Enterprises in the amount of \$278,220. Roll call vote; voting aye Steigert, Read, Spella, Smith, Glogowski, Dianis. Motion carried; 6 ayes, 0 nays.

Mr. Al Mazola was promoted to Street Superintendent.
