

Every year, the Village of Algonquin provides an annual report to its residents and businesses in a calendar format. Your Village elected officials and staff hope this document serves as a valuable tool in the new year while reflecting on the many accomplishments of 2025 and looking forward to those to come in 2026.

#### **Text A Physician Program Launched**

The Village launched a telehealth cooperative to give residents convenient access to licensed healthcare providers through MD Health Pathways. A \$6.00 monthly fee appears as a separate line item on residential utility bills. All households are automatically enrolled, with the option to opt out at any time. The program allows unlimited "visits" with licensed medical professionals remotely through text, phone call or video call. No copays or insurance are required. ### Scooter & E-Bike Safety Rules Enforced

The Village has received an increase in complaints and concerns about unsafe or disruptive riding behavior involving electric bikes, scooters, and other motorized devices. To ensure public safety, these devices are not permitted on Village streets, sidewalks, parks, parking lots, or other public property.

Use is generally limited to private property with the owner's permission. Citations may be issued for use where not permitted, and unsafe or disorderly operation may result in additional enforcement actions, including impoundment for repeat violations.

Parents are encouraged to review these rules with their children to help keep Algonquin's neighborhoods safe for everyone.

## **ADA Transition Plan Nearing Approval**

The Village's Americans with Disabilities Act Transition Plan for sidewalks, multi-use paths, and intersections is near completion. The goal is to improve accessibility for everyone in Algonquin, including people with disabilities. A key priority will be to improve access to parks and other key public community destinations. Anticipated approval is Spring 2026.

#### All Lead Line Replacements Completed

The Village completed its Lead Service Line Replacement Program two decades ahead of the IEPA's 2042 deadline.

The Village inspected approximately 242 service lines and confirmed 162 of them as lead lines. Each of these has now been replaced with new copper lines running from the Village's water main to the meter inside the home. Lead has never been present in Algonquin's treated drinking water or in

the 180 miles of water mains that deliver water to homes and businesses. Annual water quality reports continue to confirm the safety and reliability of the Village's water supply.

#### Willoughby Farms Park Master Plan Ready

The Village adopted the Final Master Plan for Willoughby Farms Park located at 2001 Wynnfield Drive. This comprehensive redevelopment vision

transforms the beloved 12-acre park into a vibrant and inclusive recreational space for all ages.

Key features of the revitalized park include: Four new pickleball courts; A nature-themed creative play area and zip-line; A restroom building and shaded pergola with swings; A multi-use sports court for basketball; badminton, and futsal; and Boardwalk access, fishing stations, and new native planting areas. Construction is anticipated to begin in Summer 2026.



### **Tree City USA Awarded**

The Arbor Day Foundation announced that the Village of Algonquin is again named a Tree City USA community for its commitment to urban forestry. This is the 28th year in which Algonquin has received this designation. The Village is responsible for the maintenance of over 21,000 parkway trees.

### **Algonquin Wins the Triple Crown**

The Government Finance Officers Association's Triple Crown recognizes governments who have received GFOA's Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting, Popular Annual Financial Reporting Award, and the Distinguished Budget Presentation Award. The Village was one of a handful of local governments in the nation to receive this distinguished recognition.

# Form of Government

The Village of Algonquin is formally organized under the Trustee-Village form of government and combines the strong political leadership of elected officials (in the form of the Village Board) with the professional experiences of an appointed local government administrator. The Board consists of a President, six Trustees, and a Village Clerk, elected at large to serve overlapping four-year terms. The Board appoints the Village Manager to carry out its directives and oversee the delivery of public services. The Village Manager also supervises the daily operations of the Village and all of its departments.

In 1995, the Board passed an ordinance that modeled the Village's government after the Council-Manager form. According to the Illinois City/County Management Association, "Under the council-manager form, power is concentrated in the elected council, which hires a professional administrator to implement its policies. This appointee serves at the pleasure of the council and has responsibility for preparing the budget, directing day-to-day operations, personnel staffing changes, and serving as the council's chief policy advisor."

This stormwater basin is designed to capture runoff from rain events and gradually release it downstream, helping to reduce the risk of flooding in surrounding areas. When naturalized with native wetland vegetation, these basins provide additional benefits beyond flood control. They help stormwater soak into the ground, filter out pollutants, and improve the quality of water entering our creeks and streams. The Village actively manages these restored natural areas through routine planting and care of wetland species, which not only enhance water quality but also provide valuable wildlife habitat and strengthen the overall health of our local ecosystems.



# WATER SYSTEM STATUS

**Grafton Township** 

Check signs posted throughout town, check the Village's website (www.algonquin.org), or call 847-658-2700 to check the current water status. Status regulations are as follows:

**CONSERVATION:** Green signs indicate outside water use is permitted except for watering landscaping and lawns, which is prohibited between the hours of 9:00 am and 6:00 pm.

EVEN/ODD: Yellow signs indicate even/odd days for watering before 9:00 am and after 6:00 pm. Even addresses may only water on even calendar days and odd addresses may only water on odd calendar days, before 9:00 am and after 6:00 pm.

**EVENIODD 6:00-9:00 AME** Orange signs indicate even/odd days for watering only between the hours of 6:00 am and 9:00 am. Even addresses may only water on even calendar days and odd addresses may only water on odd calendar days from 6:00 am to 9:00 am.

**RESTRICTED** Red signs indicate no outside water is allowed at any time. This includes all use of water outside, such as washing vehicles, power washing, and watering landscaping.

The Village has a zero tolerance policy for illegal watering and tickets will be issued for illegal watering.
