

Algonquin Police Receive ILEAP Accreditation

The Algonquin Police Department has been awarded accredited status by the Illinois Law Enforcement Accreditation Program (ILEAP), as administered by the Illinois Association of Chiefs of Police.

Police Chief Russell Laine stated, "The Algonquin Police Department is honored to have achieved this coveted status. It is our goal to maintain a level of professionalism with the highest standard for excellence. The community we serve, and the department members who serve them, expect no less. I am proud of this organization and the people in my charge who aspire to deliver this high standard of service."

As of October 2012, there are only 12 agencies statewide to receive the ILEAP accredited status. To maintain accredited status, the Algonquin Police Department must continue to meet or exceed the ILEAP standards until the reaccreditation in November 2016. E-Waste Recycling Event

The Village of Algonquin will hold an E-Waste Recycling Event on May 18 between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. Bring your unwanted qualifying electronics to the Algonquin Public Works Facility, 110 Meyer Drive. This event will be open to all Village of Algonquin residents.

Electronics that qualify for this event and will be taken at no charge include desktop PCs, laptop PCs, monitors (CRT & LCD), keyboards, mice, cords, cables (power, USB, etc.), hard drives, miscellaneous computer components, CD-ROM drives, zip drives, tape drives, printers, televisions, console televisions, VCRs, DVD players, handheld electronic organizers, handheld games, video game players, joysticks/game controls, cameras (film and digital), camcorders, radios, stereos, portable CD players, typewriters, word processors, fax machines, scanners, telephones, microwaves, toasters, and pagers. Items that are NOT included in this recycling effort include, but are not limited to, white goods (refrigerators, stoves, freezers, dishwashers, dryers, air conditioner units, and other appliances labeled as such), medical waste products, household and vehicle batteries, curling irons, and rubber-based items.

Spring Cleanup

In April, the Village, along with Waste Management, will sponsor a Village-wide cleanup program for single-family residences and townhomes that currently receive residential refuse and recycling services. This program is to encourage residents to reduce fire hazards in their homes and to "spruce up" their neighborhoods. STICKERS ARE NOT REQUIRED FOR THIS SPECIAL PICKUP. Typical items to be discarded include toys, clothes, couches, beds, dressers, and patio furniture.

Items that will **not** be collected include automobile parts, landscape waste, white goods, electronics, and construction materials. More information and a detailed schedule are available at www.algonquin.org.

Spring Hydrant Flushing

As a regular maintenance practice, the Village of Algonquin Utilities Division flushes all fire hydrants throughout the Village twice a year. Spring hydrant flushing is performed in six different zones and will begin on April 15, concluding May 31. Residents are encouraged to avoid using water while hydrant flushing is taking place as temporary losses of water pressure and water discoloration may be possible. Rain Barrel/Composter Sale

Lower your water bill by using rain water collected in a rain barrel for watering your plants this summer. Save money by composting your table scraps in your new tumbling composter. Algonquin has partnered with the Land Conservancy of McHenry County to sell rain barrels and composters. Order online at www.conservemc.org and select Algonquin for the pickup location. Orders must be placed by May 5. Ordered items can be picked up May 10 - May 11 at the Ganek Municipal Center, 2200 Harnish Drive.

Free Leaf & Brush Collection

Waste Management will provide free collection of leaves and branches (tied in bundles which are not more than 4 feet in length and 2 feet in diameter) April 1 - April 26. Leaves must be placed in standard paper yardwaste bags or reusable containers that are clearly marked with a red "X." Place the bags or cans at the curb on your regular collection day. Leaves placed in loose piles will NOT be collected.

Grass clippings and other yardwaste will still require a collection sticker. Any bags or cans that contain leaves mixed with other yardwaste will also require a collection sticker. The stickers for garbage and yardwaste are interchangeable. Please contact Waste Management at 800-796-9696 with questions regarding leaf and brush collection.
