Kelliher Park

Located at 800 Square Barn Road. This park provides a great start/end to the bike ride. The park includes restrooms, drinking fountains, parking, and a playground.

Wetland Complex

Manchester Lakes, the School Campus and Kelliher Park were all built around a large wetland complex. The wetlands have been preserved and continue to serve a vital role in the ecosystem, cleaning water and providing habitat.

Rain Garden

The Village of Algonquin has planted a rain garden at the water treatment plant. The rain garden is a pilot project to show how rain gardens work. Rain water is collected in the garden and filtered by native plants as the rain water soaks into the ground.
