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James B. Wood Park

Located at 3711 Persimmon Drive. This neighborhood park features a playground, open field and natural wetland for wildlife viewing. A wonderful rest stop during your ride.

Algonquin Area Public Library

Located at 2600 Harnish Drive. Read up on riparian areas and creeks before your ride. When you're finished, a trail connects you directly from the library to the Woods Creek trail to start your ride.

Kelliher Park

Located at 800 Square Barn Road, this the perfect place to start/end your ride. There are restrooms, drinking fountains, parking, playgrounds and ball fields.

Spella Wetland Overlook at Park

Located at 2610 Harnish Drive, with amenities accessible near Wintergreen Terrace. Here you will see the largest wetland owned by the Village. Previously used as farmland, wetland hydrology was restored and replanted with native vegetation. This area is now home to over 30 species of birds.



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
