<u>COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT</u> ~ Mr. Arps reported the following:

1- Community Conservation Day will be held this Friday at Woods Creek from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. 2- Art on the Fox was very successful this year with 26 exhibitors and four food vendors. 3- Final inspections are issued for the Village Creek development.

PUBLIC WORKS ~ Mr. Mitchard reported the following:

1- There are delays in the Indian Grove project design which is a complex project; the residents have been advised of the delays. 2- The final stages for the Highland/Edgewood Drive project are beginning and we are preparing for bids. 3- Fieldcrest Farms road construction bids will be reviewed.

<u>POLICE DEPARTMENT</u> ~ Chief Laine reported the following:

1- Founders' Days events are being planned with all village departments. 2- A roadside safety stop was conducted recently with many violations issued including several DU's. 3- Officer Chris Filippini is retiring after 25 years of service. There will be a retirement party for former Deputy Chief Ed Urban on June 28 at GCI.

VILLAGE ATTORNEY ~ Ms. Cahill reported the following

1. Her staff was working on liquor issues, agreements, and conceal carry matters.

At this time, Mr. Brad Stewart from Zukowski, Rogers, Flood & McArdle updated the Village Board regarding the proposed concealed carry law that sits on the Governor's desk for signing. Governor Quinn has until July 9 to do so. Mr. Stewart gave a technical summary of the bill and answered questions specific to the legislation. This a complex issue with many questions, and the Board was warned by President Schmitt to give these issues serious thought. Also discussed was the possibility of a local semiautomatic assault weapons ordinance. All these issues have to be discussed further as a local municipality has only ten days to pass ordinances after the state bill is signed.
