

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF ALGONQUIN, McHENRY & KANE COUNTIES, ILLINOIS HELD IN THE VILLAGE BOARD ROOM ON JANUARY 6, 2015

<u>CALL TO ORDER</u>: President Schmitt tonight's meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. Village Clerk Jerry Kautz called the roll with Trustees Debby Sosine, Brian Dianis, Jerrold Glogowski, Jim Steigert, Robert Smith, John Spella. NEW BUSINESS:

1. The Village is objecting to a McHenry County zoning request for a Conditional Use Permit to construct a digital off-premises commercial advertising sign (billboard) at the northeast corner of Route 31 and Oakwood Court (County Petition # 2014043). Within the county's new Unified Development Ordinance, digital billboards are allowed as a conditional use (which is the same as a special use permit). In general, billboards create issues of blight, reduced property values, reduced motorist safety, light pollution, and disregard for neighboring properties and uses. This has been proven in several studies that demonstrate both reduced property values in areas that have billboards and increased issues of distraction that reduce traffic safety. Digital billboards create additional concerns with brightness levels and the added distraction of changing displays and possible animation (although county regulations require the display to remain stationary for ten seconds and animation is prohibited).

Moved by Steigert, seconded by Glogowski, to adopt Resolution 2015-R-01, Objecting to a Request for a Conditional Use Permit for a Digital Off Premise Commercial Advertising Sign (McHenry County Case #2014-043) Voice vote: ayes carried.

<u>ADJOURNMENT</u>: There being no further business, it was moved by Spella, seconded by Sosine, to adjourn. Voice vote: ayes carried.
