

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF ALGONQUIN, MCHENRY & KANE COUNTIES, ILLINOIS HELD IN THE VILLAGE BOARD ROOM ON OCTOBER 20, 2015

<u>CALL TO ORDER</u>: President Schmitt called tonight's meeting to order at 7:30 PM. Village Clerk Jerry Kautz called the roll with Trustees Brian Dianis, Jerrold Glogowski, Jim Steigert, Robert Smith, John Spella, Debby Sosine, and Robert Smith. A quorum was established. <u>ADMINISTRATION</u> ~ Mr. Schloneger reported the following:

- 1- The Village was again recognized for its achievements in Performance Management, a great honor as only a handful of communities nationally earn this distinction. Criteria for the award include incorporation of data gathering and verification, public reporting, benchmarking and networking, strategic planning, community surveying, staff development, and continuous improvement.
- 2- The Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada (GFOA) announced that the Village of Algonquin has received the GFOA's Distinguished Budget Presentation Award for its Fiscal Year 2015 2016 budget. This is the twelfth year in a row the Village has received this prestigious award. The award represents a significant achievement by the Village. It reflects the commitment of the Village Board and staff to meeting the highest principles of governmental budgeting. In order to receive the budget award, the Village had to satisfy nationally recognized guidelines for effective budget presentation.

<u>COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT</u> ~ Mr. Arps reported the following:
