

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF ALGONQUIN, MCHENRY & KANE COUNTIES, ILLINOIS HELD IN THE VILLAGE BOARD ROOM ON APRIL 19, 2016

<u>CALL TO ORDER</u>: President Schmitt called tonight's meeting to order at 7:30 PM. Village Clerk Jerry Kautz called the roll with the following trustees present; Brian Dianis, John Spella, Robert Smith, Jim Steigert, Debby Sosine, Jerrold Glogowski. A quorum was established.
