PUBLIC HEARING FOR CONSIDERATION OF MAJOR IMPROVEMENTS IN THE OLD TOWN DISTRICT CASE NO. PC09-03 150 S. MAIN FOR RE-SIDING OF FRONT OF BUILDING..

PETITIONER: MIKE MAROTTA

PRESENT: Chairman Jolitz. Members Coleman, Purn, Zange, Nee, Koeppel, Cole Village: Ben Mason. Petitioner: Mike Marotta

Mr. Mason informed the Commission that Petitioner is requesting a Certificate Of Approval to re-side the front elevation of his building. Petitioner is also planning on adding trim around windows and doors plus decorative brackets to the top of the façade. Staff feels this plan will enhance the exterior of this building and recommends approval.

After further questioning of the Petitioner and discussions, it was moved by Member Nee to recommend approval of the request for a COA on property located at 150 S. Main for the re-siding of the front of the building plus the addition of trim to doors and windows, along with the replacement of brackets to the top of the facade. Motion seconded by Member Zange.

PUBLIC HEARING FOR CONSIDDRATION OF A MAJOR IMPROVEMENT IN THE OLD TOWN DISTRICT CASE NO. PC09-04, 132 DIVISION ST. FOR PORCH ALTERATIONS, REPLACE WINDOWS, RE-SIDING OF BUILDING ALONG WITH THE REPLACEMENT OF THE CONCRETE STEPS.

PETITIONER: GLENN STORM

PRESENT: Chairman Jolitz. Members: Coleman, Purn, Nee, Zange, Koeppel Cole Village: Ben Mason. Petitioners: Mr & Mrs Glenn Storm

Mr. Mason informed the Commission that the Petitioner is requesting a COA to re-side the building. Perform porch alterations, replace windows and concrete steps.

Chairman Jolitz informed the Petitioner that the Commission has an extensive resource library that could be put to their use for research into the various ornamentations they wished to replace. Chairman Jolitz stated the history of this building from 1904 was originally Italianate in style. It had full corner boards and a wraparound porch which was original to the building. The original porch columns were round. The hand rails were turned spindles. The bracketing is gone as are the corner boards and frieze board.

After considerable discussion with the Petitioner as to how to approach this rather sizeable exterior renovation, it was impressed upon Mr. Storm to keep in close contact with the building department throughout the renovation.

A motion was made by Member Purn to recommend approval of the COA on property located at 132 Division Case No. PC09-04 for rather extensive alterations and renovations as follows:

- 1. Windows to be replaced with double hung windows into their original placements.( one over one lights)
- 2. Re-siding of entire home with 3-4 inch clapboard.
- 3.6 inch nominal corner boards and frieze boards.
- 4. Replace bracketing
- 5. Concrete stairs to be replaced with wooden stairs on back porch. Open up front porch.
- 6. All porch and stair work must meet village code.

Motion seconded by Member Cole
