On April 6, 2010, the Village Board unanimously approved the Fiscal Year 2010-2011 annual operating budget for the Village of Algonquin. The Village's \$32 million budget is used as a tool to assist Village officials in making sound and rational choices for the provision of public services. Construction Info

The following are a few of the major construction projects happening in Algonquin this summer. Please consult the Village Construction Projects page at www.algonquin.org for detailed construction and detour information.

Hanson Road: Reconstruction of Hanson Road from Edgewood Road to just north of Huntington Drive. Scheduled completion in fall 2010.

North Harrison Street: As part of the Algonquin Hills Phase 4 project, Harrison Street will be reconstructed from just north of Ericson Marina north to the Village limits. Detours and traffic restrictions will be in place.

Old Oak Subdivision: Resurfacing of Old Oak Circle, Kingsbury Court, Plymouth Court, Cornell Lane, and Olin Court. Scheduled completion in summer 2010.

Water Conservation Regulations

Help conserve water this summer and save money by limiting the use of water for irrigation. For ways to save water, visit the Village website and click on Water Status.

The water status regulates the use of outside water for the purposes of watering landscape material. Watering restrictions are strictly enforced. To check current water system status, see signs posted on main streets in the Village, call Village Hall 847-658-2700, or look on the Village's website www.algonguin.org.

CONSERVATION: Green signs indicate outside water use is permitted except for watering landscaping and lawns which is prohibited between the hours of 9:00 am and 6:00 pm.

EVEN/ODD: Yellow signs indicate even/odd days for watering before 9:00 am and after 6:00 pm. Even addresses may only water on even calendar days, and odd addresses may only water on odd calendar days before 9:00 am and after 6:00 pm. EVEN/ODD 6:00-9:00 AM: Orange signs indicate even/odd days for watering only between the hours of 6:00 am and 9:00 am. Even addresses may only water on even calendar days, and odd addresses may only water on odd calendar days from 6:00 am to 9:00 am.

RESTRICTED: Red signs indicate no outside water use is allowed at any time. This includes all use of water outside, such as washing vehicles, power washing, and watering landscaping.

Burning Ordinance Reminder

The Algonquin Municipal Code now requires recreational fires to be at least 15 feet from any building or structure when contained in a permanent fire pit and 25 feet from any building or structure when contained within a portable unit. The maximum area of a recreational fire shall not exceed 3 feet by 3 feet and not exceed 2 feet in height. The burning of rubbish, construction material, grass, brush and leaves is prohibited and shall not create smoke that causes a public nuisance. Any outdoor burning which falls outside the scope of a recreational fire is considered a bonfire or open burning. Bonfires are prohibited, and open burning requires a special permit issued by the Fire Protection District that serves the property. For more info, please visit www.algonquin.org.

E-Waste Recycling Event

Dispose of your old, unwanted electronics at the Village of Algonquin's E-Waste Recycling Event on Saturday, August 14, from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm. The event will be held at the Public Works Facility, 110 Meyer Drive, and is only open to Village of Algonquin residents - proof of residency is required. Electronics that qualify for this event and will be taken at no charge include desktop PC's, laptops, monitors, keyboards, mice, LCD monitors, cords, cables, hard drives/pc components, CD rom/DVD/zip and tape drives, printers, televisions (including consoles), VCR's, DVD players, handheld electronic organizers, video game players, joysticks, game control, cameras (film & digital), camcorders, radios, stereos, portable CD players, typewriters, word processors, fax machines, scanners, telephones, and pagers.
