

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF ALGONQUIN, MCHENRY & KANE COUNTIES, IL HELD IN VILLAGE HALL ON JULY 18, 2006

<u>CALL TO ORDER</u>: Village President John Schmitt brought the regular meeting to order at 8:00 PM. Village Clerk Jerry Kautz called the roll.

ROLL CALL: Present: Trustees John Spella, Robert Smith, Jerrold Glogowski, Brian Dianis, Jim Steigert, Barbara Read. A quorum was established.

Staff in attendance: Administration – William Ganek, Robert Mitchard, Craig Arps, Russell Laine. Attorney – H. David Rogers, Engineer – Frank Cuda.

PLEDGE TO FLAG: Clerk Kautz led all present in the Pledge of Allegiance.

<u>PRESENTATION</u>: Police Officer Steve Stachura presented the "Saved by the Belt" Award to two young ladies, Kelsey and Megan who were involved in a recent serious accident on Randall Road. They were unharmed due to wearing their seat belts.

<u>ADOPT AGENDA</u>: Moved by Smith, seconded by Dianis, to adopt tonight's agenda deleting item 15 Executive Session. Voice vote; ayes carried.

AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION:

1. David Bocek, 1121 Millcreek Lane, Algonquin, voiced concern regarding his water quality as not being acceptable. He said it not only smells bad but only brownish in color and causing staining of clothes and dishes when washed. He said he purchased a water softener and a whole house water filtering system for drinking water, and then showed the Board a filter from his system that was brown and dirty after only one months use. He did say his water is acceptable now but several of his neighbors are having problems and some can not afford home filtering systems. He wants to know what is causing this condition. Mr. Ganek did respond saying that iron levels for the wells being used are high but not unsafe. He also stated that Staff should have been notified as soon as this condition started. President Schmitt said there is something unique to that block and staff needs to investigate. Mr. Mitchard added there are various reasons for iron in the water even with filtering systems but Algonquin water is well within the E.P.A. standards and safe to drink. He would not be hesitant to drink this water himself. Mr. Bocek's neighbors are advised to call the Village as soon as the water problems arise.
