June 7, 2011

STAFF REPORTS:

<u>ADMINISTRATION</u> ~ Mr. Ganek reported the following:

1. There have been modifications on the Village website that include safety procedures for heat advisory weather conditions.

<u>COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT</u> ~ Mr. Farnum reported the following:

- 1. We welcomed the following new businesses town: Charming Charlie, Rue 21, and Mobileshack in the Algonquin Commons; Precision Eye Care in Eastgate Court; Downtown Dogs at 107 South Main; Algonquin Mexican Restaurant at 648 South Main; and Georgia's Pancake House in the former IHOP building
- 2. Gordmans plans to open July 20, 2011, Primrose plans to open September 1, 2011.

<u>PUBLIC WORKS</u> ~ Mr. Mitchard reported the following:

1 -Tree planting and removal are taking place throughout the Village, with 700-800 trees purchased under a grant program being put in place. 2 – The North Harrison roadway project should be completed within 30 days. 3 – North River Road is currently undergoing patching. This could possibly become a future FAU project. 4 - Royal Hill Road work has begun. 5 – After inspection, it was noted that Jacobs Tower is experiencing exterior paint failure; the interior is not experiencing problems. This will be repaired at no expense to the Village.

<u>POLICE DEPARTMENT</u> ~ Deputy Chief Urban reported the following:

The police department went live on June 6 with the Field Based Reporting (FBR) and Records Management System (RMS) components of VisionAir. This software is used by police agencies countywide, and it interfaces with the Computer Aided Dispatch System (CAD) and allows for the sharing of information on the county level. The VisionAir software is provided by the McHenry County ETSB, and there is no cost to individual agencies.

The police department met with Founders' Days Committee members to discuss plans for the 2011 Founders' Days Festival. Representatives from other Village departments, the Fire Department, and McHenry County Emergency Management Agency were present as well.
