1 - Hoping to get the Cornish Park Clock installed soon.
2 - With the recent storm event in town there were no major problems reported, just some minor tree damage.
3 - The Wastewater Treatment Plant excavation is preceding full speed, with all other plant construction in progress.
4 - Bids for the Towne Park Pedestrian Bridge came in too high so staff is working for re-bids.
5 - Future Road projects will be in preparation.
6 - Preparation for the Snow & Ice Plan is ongoing with all equipment being reconstructed.
7 - No Ash Trees are being planted in the Village Fall Tree Planting due to the possible Ash Borer insect problem.

COMMUNITY PLANNING DIRECTOR ~ Mr. Mihelich reported the following:

1 - The Planning & Zoning Commission will be discussing Riverside Square plans, and a McDonald's development plan.2 - Staff is preparing for the Country Harvest Day event.3 - There is a new building planned for the Corporate Campus.
