
Why Economic Development Matters

Winter Parking Regulations

Beginning **October 31**, parking will be prohibited on all public streets in the Village between the hours of **2:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m.** The winter parking hours will be in effect until April 15, 2019.

In addition, it is unlawful to park on the street after any snowfall of 2 inches or greater unless the street has been cleared of snow. The snowfall parking ban is in place for your safety and will remain in effect until snow removal operations have been completed. Violators will be issued tickets.

Short-term parking may be allowed under special circumstances. Residents may request parking permission online at www.algonquin.org/police or by contacting Police Department at 847-658-4531.

Fall Cemetery Cleanup

Fall Cleanup occurs the last Monday of October each year. Please have all fall decorations removed prior to the last Monday of October (October 29, 2018). Winter decorations, such as blankets and wreaths, may be placed the Saturday before Thanksgiving (November 17, 2018).

Road Construction Update

Old Town Algonquin: In February 2018, construction began transforming Main Street into a beautiful, pedestrian friendly environment while helping to preserve the character and history of the area. This phase of construction will last through December and include updated utilities, street improvements and enhanced pedestrian amenities. **Local stores and restaurants are open for business.** For project details, please visit oldtownalgonquin.org.

Gaslight Drive: Several roadways in the Gaslight Terrace Subdivision (Gaslight Drive, Kingston Place, and Springhill Drive) will be rehabilitated including replacement of the asphalt surface, subbase repair, curb and gutter repair, spot driveway apron repair, ADA improvements, and storm sewer repairs. Work is expected to be complete in November 2018.

Longmeadow Parkway: Construction began in early 2016. Two sections have been constructed and two more sections are under construction. The construction of the last section, from IL 31 to IL 25 and a new bridge over the Fox River, is anticipated to occur from late 2018 to late 2021. Randall Road: NICOR, ComEd and AT&T utility relocations are scheduled to begin in September, continuing through the winter and into spring of 2019. Additional construction activity that will be getting underway this fall includes median removals, temporary pavement installation, tree removal, temporary street lighting, and temporary signal installations. Fall Hydrant Flushing Schedule

As a regular maintenance practice, the Village of Algonquin Utilities Division flushes all fire hydrants throughout the Village twice a year. This exercise not only ensures proper operation of each hydrant but helps to move fresh water throughout the distribution system, improving overall water quality. **Flushing will take place between September 10 and November 2, weather permitting.** Please visit www.algonquin.org/publicworks for a detailed schedule.

Fall Brush Collection

Groot will provide free collection of leaves and branches, on your scheduled collection day, **October 1 through December 14, 2018.** Branches must not exceed 2 inches in diameter and should be tied in bundles that are not more than 4 feet in length, 24 inches in diameter and 50 pounds in weight. Leaves must be placed in standard paper yard waste bags or reusable containers that are clearly marked with a red "X" on the outside. Place reusable containers or bags at the curb on your regular collection day. Leaves placed in loose piles will NOT be collected.

Grass clippings and other yard waste will still require a collection sticker. Any bags or cans that contain leaves mixed with other yard waste will also require a collection sticker. The stickers for garbage and yard waste are interchangeable.
