**FIFTH CONTINUATION OF  
DECLARATION OF LOCAL STATE OF EMERGENCY  
IN THE VILLAGE OF ALGONQUIN, ILLINOIS**

On March 17, 2020, April 7, 2020, May 19, 2020, June 16, 2020, and July 16, 2020, John C. Schmitt, the former President of the Village of Algonquin declared a Local State of Emergency in the Village of Algonquin in response to the Coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) with the most recent Declaration in effect until August 15, 2020.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the office of Village President by the Illinois Municipal Code in Section 5/11-1-6, the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act in Section 3305/11, and the Municipal Code of the Village of Algonquin, in Chapter 8, Emergency Services and Disaster Agency, I, Debby Sosine, the President of the Village of Algonquin, do hereby declare that a Local State of Emergency still exists as of this date, August 15, 2020, and shall continue until September 14, 2020.

I find that an emergency, as defined in Chapter 8, Emergency Services and Disaster Agency, still exists in that there is a pandemic of the Coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19).

The following facts substantiate such a finding:

- Coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) is a potentially severe acute respiratory infection caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2). The virus was first identified as the cause of an outbreak of pneumonia of unknown cause in Wuhan City, Hubei Province, China, in December 2019; and
- On March 9, 2020, Governor J.B. Pritzker declared all counties in the State of Illinois as a disaster area which continues to remain in effect; and
- On March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization characterized the COVID-19 outbreak as a pandemic; and
- On March 11, 2020, McHenry County Board Chair Jack D. Franks proclaimed that a disaster emergency exists for the County of McHenry which continues to remain in effect; and
- Following these actions, President John C. Schmitt issued a Proclamation of Local Disaster Emergency for the Village of Algonquin on March 17, 2020 which continues to remain in effect; and
- Governor Pritzker has issued 46 Executive Orders relating to COVID-19, which have included Executive Order 2020-10 (COVID-19 Executive Order No. 8), Executive Order 2020-18 (COVID-19 Executive Order No. 16), and Executive Order No. 2020-32 (COVID-19 Executive Order No. 30), issuing a stay at home order for state residents, restricting the operations of non-essential businesses, and mandating limitations on public and private gatherings in the State of Illinois; and
- On May 5, 2020, Governor Pritzker issued the Restore Illinois Plan, a public health approach to safely reopen Illinois, which included dividing Illinois into health regions and implementing a 5-phase plan: Phase 1-Rapid Spread, Phase 2-

Flattening, Phase 3-Recovery, Phase 4-Revitalization, and Phase 5-Illinois Restored; and

- The West Suburban Health Region and the North Suburban Health Region, of which the Village of Algonquin is a part, is in Phase 4-Revitalization with Governor Pritzker's issuance of Executive Order No. 2020-43 (COVID-19 Executive Order No. 41), requiring social distancing, wearing face coverings in public places, and limiting gatherings to fifty people.


The nature of the emergency is to control the current outbreak of the Coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19).

During the existence of the Local State of Emergency, the President shall execute such authority as provided under the Illinois Municipal Code, the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Act, and Chapter 8, Emergency Services and Disaster Agency of the Village of Algonquin Municipal Code.

This Declaration of Local State of Emergency shall be filed with the Village Clerk as soon as practicable.

I, Debby Sosine, whose name is signed to this instrument, being first duly sworn, signed and executed the instrument as the Declaration of Local State of Emergency, and that I signed willingly, and that I executed it as my free and voluntary act for the purposes therein expressed.
