STAFF REPORTS:

ADMINISTRATION:

Mr. Schloneger:

- 1. Chief Bucci announced his retirement effective December 27, 2022. An internal job posting to command staff with the rank of Deputy Chief and Sergeant has been distributed, with an application deadline of November 28th. I will lead the interview panel, which will include outside experts and stakeholders in law enforcement.
- 2. The search for the Public Works Director position has been temporarily suspended and will commence again in early 2023. Michele Zimmerman will be the acting Director upon Bob Mitchard's retirement.
- 1. Announced new Senior Accountant, Leonardo Beltran, started Monday, November 14.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT:

Mr. Shallcross:

- 1. Community Development is on pace to finish the year with the most building permits issued since 2014.
- 2. Members of the Community Development team and the Chamber of Commerce attended a Business Visitation Program with Mike Ritter and Advantage Moving.
- 3. We received 7 responses to our Comp. Plan RFP. We hope to have a consultant identified before the end of the year.

POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Deputy Chief Walker:

1. After ten weeks of school, Sgt. Cooney will be graduating from Northwestern University's School of Staff and Command on Friday afternoon.

PUBLIC WORKS:

Mr. Mitchard:

- 1. Main Street Roundabout/N. Harrison Streetscape and bike path:
 - a. North Main Street is open in both directions for access to those folks living in the Arrowhead Subdivision only. Cary Algonquin Road is completely closed to traffic and a detour is set up to route traffic to Rte 31 on Klasen Road
 - b. Nearly all of the concrete work for the Main Street Roundabout has been completed. The colored stamped concrete for the roundabout apron was poured and stamped last Friday, and subsequently protected from the weather over the weekend. Arrow Road Construction completed the binder and surface on the entire job and it look and rides well. Landscaping of the roundabout will be completed in the spring and the Village intends to hold a ribbon-cutting for the project then.
 - c. Once the lighting hardware is stood up and energized, the roundabout will be open to traffic this month, with minor closures in the spring to complete concrete work and landscaping.
- 2. Asphalt work on both court locations, Willoughby and Kelliher is complete. The fence posts are currently being installed and we anticipate the fence fabric will follow later this week.
- 3. All work on the south side of Harnish was completed last week just before the weather turned cold. Work on the north side of Harnish, mostly due to concrete supply problems, will not be completed until next spring. Notices to all properties on this project north of Harnish have been notified on social media and by a note delivered to their front door.
- 4. Riverwalk and S. Harrison Bridge Project: The contractor has relocated sheeting and set up a coffer dam on the south side of the creek to demolish the remaining south abutment wall and begin framing the new abutment wall and cap, and wing walls. The abutment was a bear to remove, but they got it done late last week. Dunnet Bay is currently driving the H-piles that will support the abutment wall. When that is complete Martam Construction will frame the abutment wall, set rebar and pour the wall. Concrete has been reserved and allocated for this pour. It we stay on track, the road should be temporarily opened to traffic just prior to Christmas.
- 5. Ratt Creek Reach 5: Creek Restoration work is complete. The contractor now has minimal grading and restoration work south of Neubert School and Jaycee Field. Plugs in the creek bed and additional trees

- will be installed in the spring, along with completion of any punch list work that may show up over the winter season.
- 6. Woods Creek Reach 5: Creek restoration south of Bunker Hill is nearing completion. Work will continue north of Bunker Hill over the next several weeks. Restoration is following behind the creek work. Final plantings and punch list will be undertaken in the spring 2023.
- 7. Tree removal contractor started actively removing trees on Monday, October 10th. East side of the river is complete and ready for replants. The contractor left the Village for a reported week and a half to complete work elsewhere, but has yet to return to town. I will pursue an answer from the contractor tomorrow to discover their intentions to finish the work, and when. Progress can be followed on the Village website for those that are interested.

A. Consider Amending Chapter 33, Liquor Control and Liquor Licensing, by Increasing the Number of A-1 Liquor License by One

Flappy's Pancake House and Restaurant, Inc. (dba) Eggceptional Café Breakfast and Lunch, 2749 W. Algonquin Road, Algonquin, an established restaurant has applied for a Class A-1 Liquor License, which would allow patrons to consume alcohol on premise as well as purchase packaged alcohol to go. Currently the Village has 33 Class A-1 license holders which to allow for Eggception to obtain I license we would need to increase the number of available Class A-1 license to 34.

Staff recommends increasing the number of available Class A-1 liquor licenses by one to accommodate the request from Eggceptional Cafe.

Following some clarification, it is the consensus of the Committee to move this on to the Village Board for approval.

AGENDA ITEM 5: Public Works & Safety

Mr. Mitchard:

A. Consider an Agreement with Water Well Solutions for the Well 11 Rehabilitation

During the routine maintenance program of Well 11, the inspection reported significant issues with the status of Well 11. The Village has used this report to form the scope of services, which includes but is not limited to mobilization, the damaged bowl assembly will be replaced with a new 4 stage Goulds submersible bowl assembly, recondition of the column pipe & testing. The well screen will also be rehabbed by having the plugging material removed via a double disk surge block with purge pump system.

During our bid process, one firm submitted a bid: Water Well Solutions in the amount of \$40,013.00.

This project did not have an engineer's estimate of cost, but comparing previous rehab projects the cost is \$40,013.00. In order to cover the cost of the proposal, it has been determined that all of the \$40,013.00 will be budgeted from account (700-44418). This decision has been made as Well 11 is a high priority installation and is currently not running due to rehabilitation need.

The Village has extensive working experience with Water Well Solutions of Elburn, IL. The contractor is very aware of the Village requirements and operations. It is for those reasons and the analysis conducted that I recommend Water Well Solutions for award in the amount of \$40,013.00 for the subject project contract. Please confirm this recommendation so that I may prepare the award and contract.

Trustee Smith asked how long the well would be down and would there be any disruption in service? Mr. Mitchard explained it would be down approximately a month. While Well 11 is down, Well 7 would then service the area with no disruption.

It is the consensus of the Committee to move this on to the Village Board for approval.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 2022 -O-

ORDINANCE abating a portion of taxes heretofore levied to pay principal of and interest on certain General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2013, of the Village of Algonquin, McHenry and Kane Counties, Illinois.

* * *

WHEREAS, Division 6 of Article VII of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois (the "Constitution") provides that the Village of Algonquin, McHenry and Kane Counties, Illinois (the "Village"), is a home rule unit, and, as such, the Village is authorized to issue its full faith and credit obligations without first submitting the question of issuing such obligations to referendum approval; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution, the Village is a home rule unit and may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs including, but not limited to, the power to tax and to incur debt; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees (the "Village Board") of the Village of Algonquin, McHenry and Kane Counties, Illinois (the "Village"), by an ordinance adopted on the 3rd day of December 2013 (the "Ordinance"), did provide for the issue of \$7,645,000 General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2013 (the "Bonds"), of the Village and the levy of a direct annual tax sufficient to pay principal and interest on the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, on the 18th day of December 2013, a duly certified copy of the Ordinance, executed by the Village officials in accordance therewith, for the Bonds, was filed in the offices of the County Clerks of The Counties of McHenry and Kane, Illinois (the "County Clerks"); and

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Ordained by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Algonquin, McHenry and Kane Counties, Illinois, as follows:

The Taxes heretofore levied in the Ordinance for the Bonds for 2022 shall be abated as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 2022 - O -

An Ordinance Amending Chapter 33, Liquor Control and Liquor Licensing, of the Algonquin Municipal Code

WHEREAS, the Village of Algonquin, McHenry and Kane Counties, Illinois, is a home rule municipality as contemplated under Article VII, Section 6, of the Constitution of the State of Illinois, and the passage of this Ordinance constitutes an exercise of the Village's home rule powers and functions as granted in the Constitution of the State of Illinois.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the VILLAGE OF ALGONQUIN, McHenry and Kane Counties, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1: Section 33.07-B, Paragraph 2, Number of Licenses Issued, of the Algonquin Municipal Code shall be amended as follows:

1. Thirty-Four Class A-1 licenses at any one time.

SECTION 2: If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, sentence or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged by any Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair, invalidate or nullify the remainder thereof, which remainder shall remain and continue in full force and effect.

SECTION 3: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 4: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect December ____, 2022, approval and publication in pamphlet form (which publication is hereby authorized) as provided by law.

Familiarity With Plans; Qualifications: Contractor/Vendor acknowledges that it (a) has examined the site of the proposed Work and is familiar with the conditions surrounding same; and (b) has examined the plans and drawings, and has studied and is aware of, and satisfied with, the requirements of the Contract Documents. Contractor/Vendor represents to Owner that it is fully experienced and properly qualified as an expert to perform the class of work provided for herein, and that it is properly equipped, organized and financed to handle such work. Contractor/Vendor shall finance its own operations hereunder, shall operate as an independent contractor and not as the agent of Owner, and shall hold Owner free and harmless from all liability, costs and charges by reason of any act or representations of Contractor/Vendor, its agents or employees.
- 4. Workmanship; Safety: All Work shall be performed by Contractor/Vendor in a neat, skillful and workmanlike manner, and all materials furnished by Contractor/Vendor shall be new and of the best description and quality of their respective kinds, unless otherwise specified and ordered by Owner in writing. All Work and/or materials shall be subject to the inspection and approval of the Owner, its engineers and representatives. Contractor/Vendor is responsible for its own and its employees' activities on the jobsite, including but not limited to, the methods of work performance, superintendence, sequencing of work, and safety in, on or about the jobsite area in which it is performing the Work under this Purchase Agreement. Owner and Contractor/Vendor shall not require any laborer or mechanic employed in performance of this Purchase Agreement to work in surroundings or under working conditions which are unsanitary, hazardous or dangerous to his health or safety, as determined under applicable federal and Illinois construction safety and health standards
- 5. Extra's and Change Orders: No claim by Contractor/Vendor that any instructions, by drawing or otherwise, constitute a change in Contractor/Vendor's performance hereunder, for which Contractor/Vendor should be paid additional compensation shall be valid, unless prior to commencing such allegedly extra or changed performance, Contractor/Vendor shall have received a written supplement to this Purchase Agreement authorizing such performance signed on behalf of Owner by a person have actual authority to do so. No claim for additional compensation on the basis that Contractor/Vendor has incurred any expense by reason of any act or failure to act or Owner or its contractor, subcontractor, materialmen or any other party shall be valid unless made in writing within 30 days of the alleged act or failure to act and approved by Owner, provided, however, that if the Contractor/Vendor should be delayed in furnishing the articles, items, equipment or materials (hereinafter sometimes referred to as "goods") or services or Work (hereinafter sometimes referred to as "Work") ordered herein, by the omission, neglect or default of Owner, its agents or employees, Contractor/Vendor shall be entitled to no additional compensation or damages for such delay, and shall be entitled only to an extension of time for a period equal to the time lost as a result of the aforesaid causes, determined by Owner. Any charges for extra not so authorized will not be paid.
- 6. Inspection and Acceptance: Owner shall have the right at all reasonable times to inspect and test all goods, materials or Work furnished by Contractor/Vendor and all Work performed or furnished by Contractor/Vendor. Notwithstanding any prior inspection, the passage of title or any prior payment, all goods, material and Work furnished thereunder are subject to final inspection and acceptance by Owner at its job site. If, after inspection, Owner rejects any goods furnish by Contractor/Vendor thereunder, Owner may, at its election, return those goods to Contractor/Vendor at Contractor/Vendor's expense, including the cost of any inspection and testing thereof. If Contractor/Vendor fails to proceed promptly with the correction or replacement of any rejected goods or Work, Owner may replace or correct such items or Work by purchase or manufacture and charge the cost incurred thereby to Contractor/Vendor or terminate this Purchase Agreement for default in accordance with paragraph 12 herein. By inspecting and not rejecting any goods and Work furnished thereunder, Owner shall not be precluded thereby from subsequently revoking its acceptance thereof it the goods or Work are later discovered to be nonconforming with this Purchase Agreement or the specifications and drawings applicable hereto, even if the defect does not substantially impair value to Owner.
- 7. <u>Taxes, Delivery, Risk of Loss</u>: Unless indicated to the contrary on the face hereof, it shall be the responsibility of Contractor/Vendor to arrange for and complete delivery of all goods or materials. If the goods or materials furnished thereunder are equipment,

Contractor/Vendor shall give Owner two (2) working days' advance notice of delivery. All goods or materials furnished by Contractor/Vendor should be shipped in the manner and at the times indicated on the face hereof at the expense of Contractor/Vendor, it being understood that the risk of loss with respect to such goods is with Contractor/Vendor until such goods come into the actual possession of Owner, regardless of the mode of delivery or earlier passage of title. This project is tax exempt. The Owner's tax-exempt number is E 9995 0855 05.

- 8. <u>Payment</u>: Owner will make partial payments to the Contractor/Vendor from time to time for the Work performed and the materials furnished by the Contractor/Vendor. Provided, however, in no event shall Owner be obligated to pay Contractor/Vendor any sum that exceeds the Contract Price absent a written change order executed by Owner.
- 8.1 Prior to issuance of any payments by the Owner to the Contractor/Vendor, the Contractor/Vendor shall furnish to the Owner (in a form suitable to the Owner) an application for the payment then due, together with receipts, waivers of claim and other evidence showing the Contractor/Vendor's payments for materials, labor and other expense incurred in the Contractor/Vendor's Work hereunder. The Owner will, at all times, be entitled to retain ten percent (10%) of all monies due and owing to the Contractor/Vendor as a part security for the faithful performance of this Agreement. This ten percent (10%) so withheld will not be paid to the Contractor/Vendor until the Owner has issued to the Contractor/Vendor a final acceptance of the Project.
- 8.2 Owner may withhold the whole or any part of any payment due to the Contractor/Vendor to the extent necessary to protect and indemnify the Owner from loss on account of (a) defective Work not remedied; (b) claims filed or reasonable evidence indicating probable filing of claims; (c) failure of the Contractor/Vendor to make payments promptly for material or labor; or (d) Contractor/Vendor's failure to furnish Owner with all written warranties and operational manuals for the Work.
- 8.3 Contractor/Vendor hereby authorizes the OWNER (1) to deduct from any amount due or becoming due the Contractor/Vendor under this Agreement for all amounts owing from the Contractor/Vendor to (a) the Owner for back-charges or services furnished for the account of the Contractor/Vendor; (b) the Owner for damages sustained whether through negligence of the Contractor/Vendor or through failure of the Contractor/Vendor to act as may be otherwise detailed herein; (c) materialmen; (d) subcontractors; (e) laborers; and (f) others for services and materials furnished to the Contractor/Vendor for the Work performed under this Agreement, and (2) to apply the amount so deducted to the payment of said materials, services, damages or back-charges applying such monies so available in the Agreement hereinbefore set forth.
- 8.4 Owner, without invalidating this Agreement, may make changes by altering, adding to or deducting from the Work to be performed. The value of any such changes will be determined as follows: (a) by the unit prices named in this Agreement, if any; or (b) by agreement in writing between the Owner and the Contractor/Vendor as to the value of the time and materials for the changes in the Work. In any event, the Contractor/Vendor will keep and present, in any form as the Owner may direct, a correct account of the net cost of any extra labor and materials, together with vouchers referring to the same.
- 8.5 Notwithstanding the payment in full for the Work hereunder, the Contractor/Vendor will be liable to repair or replace any imperfect workmanship or other faults; and if the Contractor/Vendor fails to repair or replace the imperfect workmanship or other faults, the Owner may do the Work and recover from the Contractor/Vendor the cost and expense thereof. No payment on account will be construed or considered as an approval of the Work for which payment is made.
- 9. Contractor/Vendor Warranty: Contractor/Vendor warrants in addition to all warranties which are imposed or implied by law or equity that all materials and Work furnished thereunder (a) shall confirm to any specifications and drawings applicable to this Purchase Agreement; (b) shall be merchantable and of good quality and workmanship; (c) shall be fit for the purpose intended as well as the propose for which such goods, materials or Work are generally used; and (d) except for rented equipment, shall be free from defects for a period of one (1) year, or such longer period as is specified in the Scope of Work or Contract Documents, from the date such Work is performed or such materials are utilized or installed, and if installed as part of a structure or utilized equipment, for one (1) year or such longer period as is specified in the Contract Documents, from the date any such goods, materials or Work hereunder is accepted in writing by Owner. Contractor/Vendor expressly agrees that the statute of limitations with respect to Contractor/Vendor's warranties shall begin to run on the date of acceptance by Owner.

10. Insurance and Bonds:

- 10.1 Contractor/Vendor shall at all times maintain business automobile, commercial liability and workers compensation insurance covering its work and all obligations under this Purchase Agreement, and shall name the Owner as an additional insured on its commercial liability insurance policies for Contractor/Vendor operations under this Purchase Agreement. Liability insurance limits shall be in such amounts and include such coverages as set forth in the VILLAGE OF ALGONQUIN PURCHASE ORDER INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS attached to this Agreement. Contractor/Vendor shall furnish the Village with a certificate of insurance and such other documentation (including a copy of all or part of the policy) to the Village at the time of execution of this Agreement and thereafter on an annual basis on the anniversary date of this Agreement or at any other time as the Village deems necessary to establish compliance with this provision.
- 10.2 Contractor/Vendor shall furnish and pay for surety bonds and with surety or sureties satisfactory to Owner, guaranteeing the full performance of all of the conditions and terms hereof and guaranteeing that Contractor/Vendor shall promptly pay for all labor, materials, supplies, tools, equipment and other charges or costs of Contractor/Vendor in connection with the Work. Such performance and payment bond shall be in an amount determined by Owner.
 - 10.3 Breach of this paragraph is a material breach subject to immediate termination.

11. <u>Indemnity</u>: Contractor/Vendor hereby agrees to indemnify, and hold the Owner, its directors, officers, employees, successors and assigns harmless from any and all claims, demands, liability, loss, damage, fines, penalties, attorney's fees and litigation expenses (collectively "Loss") arising out of injury to, including the death of, persons and/or damage to property, to the extent caused by the negligent acts or omissions of the Contractor/Vendor or those working at their direction.

Further:

- 11.1 Contractor/Vendor acknowledges that should any items or Work furnished hereunder prove defective, including damage to Owner supplied or constructed items, equipment or machinery, or if Contractor/Vendor is charged with any violation of any state or federal laws or regulations, the Owner shall be entitled to recover damages for breach of this Agreement, including but not limited to consequential damages, penalties, taxes or assessments (including punitive damages), costs and attorney's fees.
- 11.2 In any and all claims against Owner or any of its agents or employees, by any employee of Contractor/Vendor, the indemnification obligation under this paragraph shall not be limited by any limitation on the amount or type of damages, compensation or benefits payable by or for Contractor/Vendor under workers compensation acts, disability benefits acts or employee benefit acts, or other applicable law. Contractor/Vendor assumes the entire liability for its own negligence, and as part of this Agreement waives all defenses available to Contractor/Vendor as an employer which limit the amount of Contractor/Vendor's liability under any workers compensation, disability benefits or employee benefit laws.
- 12. Patents: Contractor/Vendor warrants that (a) goods furnished thereunder, and the sale and use thereof, shall not infringe any valid United States patent or trademark; and (b) Contractor/Vendor shall indemnify Owner for its costs to defend any suit instituted against Owner, its agents or customers, charging infringement of any United States patent or trademark by virtue of the possession, use or sale of any goods furnished thereunder is enjoined because of patent infringement. Contractor/Vendor within a reasonable amount of time shall at Contractor/Vendor's expense procure for Owner its agents or customer, the right to continue using such goods with non-infringing goods or modify such goods so that they become non-infringing or remove such goods and refund to Owner any sums paid therefore, including transportation and installation charges.
- 13. Cancellation: Time of delivery of this Purchase Agreement is of the essence and Owner may, by written notice of default to Contractor/Vendor, cancel the whole or any part of this Purchase Agreement (a) if Contractor/Vendor fails to make delivery of the goods or perform the services within the time specified herein or any extensions thereof; or (b) if Contractor/Vendor fails to perform or so fails to make progress as to endanger performance thereunder, and in either circumstance does not cure such failure within a period of two (2) days after receipt of notice from Owner specifying such failure. Owner, by written notice to Contractor/Vendor, may cancel the whole or any part of this Purchase Agreement when it is in the best interest of Owner or when Owner has been notified of modification of the specifications pertaining thereto. If this Purchase Agreement is so canceled, the Contractor/Vendor shall be compensated as follows: (a) for materials delivered and services performed, the reasonable value as part of the Contract Price; (b) for materials not identified to this Purchase Agreement and service not performed, no compensation; and (c) for Contractor/Vendor's lost profits or incidental or consequential loss, no compensation.
- 14. Remedies: Contractor/Vendor shall, for the duration of its warranties under paragraph 9 herein, at the discretion of Owner and at the expense of Contractor/Vendor, replace, repair and insure any and all faulty or imperfect goods, materials or Work furnished or performed by Contractor/Vendor thereunder. In the event Contractor/Vendor fails to do so, Owner may furnish or perform the same, and may recover from Contractor/Vendor the cost and expense directly or indirectly resulting there from, including all consequential damages but not limited to the cost or expense of inspection, testing, removal, replacement, re-installation, destruction of other materials resulting there from, any increased cost or expense to Owner in its performance under contracts with others, and reasonable attorneys fees incurred by the Owner in connection with Vendor's default and Owner's enforcement of its rights under this Purchase Agreement. The foregoing remedies shall be available in addition to all other remedies available to Owner in equity or at law including the Uniform Commercial Code.
- 15. <u>Compliance With Laws</u>: During the performance hereunder, Contractor/Vendor agrees to give all notices and comply with all Laws and Regulations of the United States and/or the State of Illinois applicable to the performance of the Work, including but not limited to those Laws and Regulations regarding the payment of prevailing wages, non-discrimination laws, employment of Illinois workers, labor, wage and collective bargaining. Except where otherwise expressly required by applicable Laws and Regulations, Owner shall not be responsible for monitoring Contractor/Vendor's compliance with any Laws or Regulations.
- 16. <u>Notices</u>: All notices, demands, requests or other communications which may be or are required to be given, served, or sent by any party to any other party pursuant to this Purchase Agreement shall be in writing and shall be hand delivered, or sent by courier, or via facsimile with confirmation to the addresses shown on the Purchase Agreement.

- 17. Records, Reports and Information: Contractor/Vendor agrees to furnish Owner with reports and information regarding the Work performed under this Purchase Agreement, at such times as Owner may reasonably request, making full disclosure of efforts made by Contractor/Vendor and the results thereof. Contractor/Vendor agrees to maintain records, documents, and other evidence which will accurately show the time spent and Work performed under this Purchase Agreement for a minimum period of five (5) years after completion of the Work, and such records shall be subject to audit by the Owner upon reasonable advance notice to Contractor/Vendor on a mutually agreed date and time.
- 18. <u>Tobacco Use</u>: Contractor/Vendor, and its agents or employees, shall refrain from smoking, or the use of any tobacco, on designated Village campuses, both indoors and outdoors, in Village-owned vehicles and in privately-owned vehicles parked on campus property at any time, including non-working hours. Designated Village campuses consist of the William J. Ganek Municipal Center, Historic Village Hall, Public Works Facility, Wastewater Treatment Plant, Water Treatment Plants, and Pumping Stations. Leaving the remains of tobacco products or any other related waste product on Village property is further prohibited.
- 19. <u>Assignment</u>: Contractor/Vendor shall not assign this Purchase Agreement without written consent of Owner. Owner may unilaterally assign its rights under this Purchase Agreement upon reasonable notice to Contractor/Vendor.
- 20. <u>Waiver</u>: Either party's failure to insist in any one or more instances, upon the strict performance of any provision hereof or to exercise any right hereunder shall not be deemed to be a waiver or relinquishment of the future performance of any such provision or the future exercise of such right, but the obligation of Contractor/Vendor and Owner with respect to such future performance shall continue in full force and effect.
- 21. Controlling Law, Severability: The validly of this Purchase Agreement or any of its provisions and the sufficiency of any performance thereunder shall be determined under the laws of Illinois. Venue shall be in McHenry County, Illinois. The Owner is entitled to recover its reasonable attorneys' fees incurred in enforcing the terms of this Purchase Agreement. If any provision or requirement of this Purchase Agreement is declared or found to be unenforceable that balance of this Purchase Agreement shall be interpreted and enforced as if the unenforceable provision or requirement was never a part hereof.
- 22. Arbitration. Any controversy or claim arising out of or relating to this Purchase Order, or the breach thereof, shall be settled by binding arbitration administered by the American Arbitration Association under its Construction Industry Arbitration Rules or JAMS Dispute Resolution, as determined in the exclusive discretion of the Owner, at the Village of Algonquin Village Hall or Public Works Department, and judgment on the award rendered by the arbitrator may be entered in any court having jurisdiction thereof. The parties agree that an arbitration award by default may be entered upon the party failing to appear or defend itself in any arbitration proceeding.
- 23. <u>Recovery of Fees.</u> In the event of arbitration of this Purchase Order between the parties, or litigation of this Purchase Order, the non-prevailing party, as determined by the arbiter or court, shall pay all expenses incurred by the prevailing party, including, but not limited to (a) attorneys' fees, (b) filing costs, (c) witness fees, and (d) other general expenses of arbitration or litigation.

ORDINANCE NO. 2022-O-__

An Ordinance Establishing Special Service Area Number 4
Within the Village of Algonquin for the Property Commonly Known
as Lots 2-6 and Outlots A, B and C of the 1st Resubdivision of the
NorthPoint Algonquin Corporate Campus Subdivision

WHEREAS, the Village of Algonquin, McHenry and Kane Counties, Illinois (the "Village") is a home rule municipality as contemplated under Article VII, Section 6, of the Constitution of the State of Illinois, and the passage of this Ordinance constitutes an exercise of the Village's home rule powers and functions as granted in the Constitution of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees (the "Corporate Authorities") of the Village adopted Ordinance No. 2022-O-39 proposing the establishment of Village of Algonquin Special Service Area Number 4 on October 4, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees held a public hearing on the question of establishing Village of Algonquin Special Service Area Number 4 on Tuesday, December 6, 2022.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the VILLAGE OF ALGONQUIN, McHenry and Kane counties, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1: **Establishment of Special Service Area Number 4**. The constitutional authority for home rule powers is set forth in Article VII, Section 6, of the Constitution of the State of Illinois in force July 1, 1971, which provides in relevant part as follows:

§ 6. Powers of Home Rule Units.

Except as limited by this Section, a home rule unit may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs including, but not limited to, the power to regulate for the protection of the public health, safety, morals and welfare; to license; to tax; and to incur debt.

Special service areas are established pursuant to the provisions of Public Act 88-455, as well as the Special Service Area Tax Law, 35 ILCS 200/27-5 *et seq.*, which provides the manner of levying or imposing taxes for the provision of special services to areas within the boundaries of home rule municipalities and non-home rule municipalities and counties.

SECTION 2: Findings. This Village's Corporate Authorities find that:

A. It is in the public interest that Special Service Area Number 4, for the purposes set forth herein, be established for the real property legally described below and commonly known as Lots 2-6 and Outlots A, B and C of the 1st Resubdivision of NorthPoint Algonquin Corporate Campus Subdivision:

LOT 2-6 AND OUTLOTS A, B AND C OF 1ST RESUBDIVISION OF NORTHPOINT ALGONQUIN CORPORATE CAMPUS BEING A SUBDIVISION OF THAT PART OF THE EAST 1/2 OF SECTION 7, TOWNSHIP 42 NORTH, RANGE 8 EAST OF THE THIRD PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN ACCORDING TO THE PLAT THEREOF RECORDED JUNE 23, 2022 PER DOCUMENT NO. 2022K032552, IN THE TOWNSHIP OF DUNDEE, KANE COUNTY, ILLINOIS (collectively, the "Area").

The Area is generally located east of Huntley Road, south of Longmeadow Parkway, west of Randall Road and northwest of the western terminus of Grandview Drive in the Village of Algonquin in Kane County and consists of approximately 133 acres and is depicted in the map attached hereto as Exhibit A.

The property identification numbers assigned to the Area are 03-07-201-002, 03-07-226-001, 03-07-226-002, 03-07-251-002, 03-07-276-001, 03-07-278-001, 03-07-251-001 and 03-07-201-001

- B. The Area is compact, contiguous and will constitute a separate and distinct industrial development within the Village of Algonquin; the Area will benefit specially from the special services to be provided and as hereinafter described; the proposed special services are in addition to municipal services provided to the Village of Algonquin as a whole; and it is therefore in the best interests of the Village that the levy of special taxes against the Area to finance the special services to be provided be considered. Such special services would include but not be limited to the following
 - 1. maintenance, restoration, preservation and replanting of vegetation and landscaping within the Area, as deemed necessary and appropriate by the Corporate Authorities; and
 - 2. maintenance, repair, restoration, dredging and removal of sediment or obstructions of and/or from any stormwater management, detention or retention area within the Area, as well as any cutting of grass or replanting of vegetation or landscaping within any of such areas within the Area as deemed necessary and appropriate by the Corporate Authorities; and
 - 3. maintenance, restoration, repair, replacement of any subdivision monument sign as well as vegetation and landscaping proximate to such sign within the Area or proximate thereto as deemed necessary and appropriate by the Corporate Authorities; and
 - 4. administrative, professionals', engineers', attorneys', consultants' and contractors' fees incurred by the Village relative to the provision of any of the above-described special services as deemed appropriate by the Corporate Authorities (collectively, the "Special Services").

However, under no circumstances shall the provision of such Special Services by the Village or its contractors constitute an acceptance of any personal property or real property within the Area by the Village.

The term of the Special Service Area is perpetual, and the nature of the Special Services is new construction and/or maintenance within the Area.

If the Village receives funds as a result of providing the Special Services, such funds may be used by the Village itself to provide the Special Services or paid to a third party contractor to provide such Special Services on behalf of the Village.

- (a) The Village previously adopted Ordinance No. 2022-O-39 on October 4, 2022, proposing the establishment of a special service area for the Area. The establishment of Special Service Area No. 4 was considered at a public hearing held on December 6, 2022, in the Village of Algonquin Ganek Municipal Center, 2200 Harnish Drive, Algonquin, Illinois 60102 at 7:15 p.m. pursuant to notice duly published in the *Daily Herald* and in accordance with the Special Service Area Tax Law at least fifteen (15) days prior to the hearing, and also pursuant to notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, addressed to the person in whose name the general taxes for the last preceding year was paid on each lot, block, tract, parcel of land lying within the Special Service Area No. 4. A Certificate of Publication of Notice and an Affidavit of Mailing of Notice are attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit B and Exhibit C, respectively. Said notices conformed in all respects to the requirements of Section 27-25 of the Special Service Area Tax Law.
- (b) At the public hearing on December 6, 2022, all interested persons were given an opportunity to be heard on the questions of the creation of the special service area for the Area and the levy of special taxes against the Area to finance the Special Services, all as set forth in the notices.
- (c) After considering all information presented to the President and Board of Trustees and at the public hearing, as well as any and all information subsequently received up until today's date, the President and Board of Trustees hereby find that it is in the public interest and in the interest of the Village that the Village of Pingree Grove Special Service Area No. 4, as described herein, be established.
- (d) The territory within Special Service Area No. 4 is contiguous as required by the Special Service Area Tax Law.
- (e) An annual special tax shall be levied against each lot and each parcel in the Special Service Area as herein described which does not exceed the tax rate or method proposed in the notice of public hearing referred to herein and such special tax, taking into account the direct and indirect special service benefits to current and future owners of property within the Special Service Area, bears a rational relationship between the amount of tax levied against each lot, block, tract and parcel of land in the Special Service Area and the special service benefit conferred.
- (f) It is in the best interest of said Special Service Area that the furnishing of the special services proposed to be considered for the common interests of said Area, and that there be levied an annual special tax to pay the cost of the Special Services.

(g) The properties within Special Service Area No. 4 will benefit specially from the Special Services.

However, prior to the Village providing any Special Services to the Area, the Village shall provide 15 days written notice to the registered agent of the Area's incorporated homeowners association of the Village's intention to provide the Special Services, unless, in the Village's reasonable determination, the Special Services need to be provided immediately because of an emergency. Unless there is an emergency, the homeowners association shall have 15 days from the date of the Village's notice regarding the work, repair, maintenance, restoration, replanting, landscaping, removal of dead landscaping, reconstruction, installation or grass cutting, maintenance, repair or replacement of the private drives, fence, berm, landscape easements, open spaces or common area within the Area, as the case may be, prior to the Village providing the Special Services to the Area. It is not the Village's intention to provide such Special Services and to adopt a tax levy against the Area unless there is a need to provide such Special Services and then only after providing notice to the registered agent of the Area's incorporated homeowners association as set forth above.

SECTION 3: **Special Service Area Levy**: The levy of an annual tax not to exceed the annual rate of .6 percent of the assessed value, as equalized, of the taxable property within the Area, shall be levied annually from the date of the establishment of the Special Service Area for the Area to pay for the Special Services to be provided. Said taxes shall be in addition to all other taxes provided by law and shall be levied pursuant to the provisions of the Special Service Area Tax Law. The amount of such tax levy for the Special Service Area for the initial year for which taxes will be levied within the special service area shall not exceed \$25,000 and shall not exceed the annual rate of .6 percent of the assessed value, as equalized, of the taxable property within the Area.

SECTION 4: **Effective Date:** No petition meeting the statutory requirements set forth in the Special Service Area Tax Law has been filed objecting to the creation of Special Service Area No. 4 or the levy or imposition of a special service area tax. As such, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet manner form as provided by law. The Village Clerk is hereby directed and ordered to file a certified copy of this Ordinance with the Kane County Clerk and the Kane County Recorder, within sixty (60) days of the effective date hereof.

SECTION 5: If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, sentence or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged by any Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair, invalidate or nullify the remainder thereof, which remainder shall remain and continue in full force and effect.

The term of the proposed Special Service Area would be perpetual and the nature of the Special Services is new construction and/or maintenance within the Area.

If funds are received by the Village through this proposed special service area, such funds may be used by the Village itself to provide the Special Services or paid to a third party contractor to provide such Special Services on behalf of the Village.

A special service area tax will be considered at the public hearing, to be levied annually and not exceed a maximum rate of .6 percent per annum of assessed value, as equalized, to be levied against the real, taxable property included within the proposed Special Service Area. The proposed amount of such tax levy for the Special Services for the initial year for which taxes will be levied within the proposed special service area will not exceed \$25,000 but shall not exceed the annual maximum rate of .6 percent of the assessed value, as equalized, of the taxable property within the Area.

If a petition signed by at least 51 percent of the electors residing within the Special Service Area and by at least 51 percent of the owners of record of the land included within the Area is filed with the Village of Algonquin Village Clerk within 60 days following the final adjournment of the public hearing objecting to the creation of the Special Service Area, or the levy or imposition of a tax, no such special service area may be created or tax levied or imposed.

ORDINANCE NO. 2022-O-

An Ordinance Establishing Special Service Area Number 5 Within the Village of Algonquin for the Property Commonly Known as Lot 1 and Outlot D of the 1st Resubdivision of NorthPoint Algonquin Corporate Campus Subdivision

WHEREAS, the Village of Algonquin, McHenry and Kane Counties, Illinois (the "Village") is a home rule municipality as contemplated under Article VII, Section 6, of the Constitution of the State of Illinois, and the passage of this Ordinance constitutes an exercise of the Village's home rule powers and functions as granted in the Constitution of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees (the "Corporate Authorities") of the Village adopted Ordinance No. 2022-O-40 proposing the establishment of Village of Algonquin Special Service Area Number 5 on October 4, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees held a public hearing on the question of establishing Village of Algonquin Special Service Area Number 5 on Tuesday, December 6, 2022.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the VILLAGE OF ALGONQUIN, McHenry and Kane counties, Illinois, as follows:

SECTION 1: **Establishment of Special Service Area Number 5**. The constitutional authority for home rule powers is set forth in Article VII, Section 6, of the Constitution of the State of Illinois in force July 1, 1971, which provides in relevant part as follows:

§ 6. Powers of Home Rule Units.

Except as limited by this Section, a home rule unit may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs including, but not limited to, the power to regulate for the protection of the public health, safety, morals and welfare; to license; to tax; and to incur debt.

Special service areas are established pursuant to the provisions of Public Act 88-455, as well as the Special Service Area Tax Law, 35 ILCS 200/27-5 et seq., which provides the manner of levying or imposing taxes for the provision of special services to areas within the boundaries of home rule municipalities and non-home rule municipalities and counties.

SECTION 2: Findings. This Village's Corporate Authorities find that:

A. It is in the public interest that Special Service Area Number 5, for the purposes set forth herein, be established for the real property legally described below and commonly known as Lot 1 and Outlot D of the 1st Resubdivision of NorthPoint Algonquin Corporate Campus Subdivision:

LOT 1 AND OUTLOT D OF 1ST RESUBDIVISION OF NORTHPOINT ALGONQUIN CORPORATE CAMPUS BEING A SUBDIVISION OF THAT PART OF THE EAST 1/2 OF SECTION 7, TOWNSHIP 42 NORTH, RANGE 8 EAST OF THE PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN ACCORDING TO THE PLAT THEREOF RECORDED JUNE 23, 2022 PER DOCUMENT NO. 2022K032552, IN THE TOWNSHIP OF DUNDEE, KANE COUNTY, ILLINOIS (the "Area").

The Area is located at the southwest corner of the intersection of Longmeadow Parkway and Randall Road in the Village of Algonquin in Kane County and consists of approximately 14 acres and is depicted in the map attached hereto as Exhibit A.

The property identification numbers assigned to the Area are 03-07-227-001 and 03-07-277-001.

- B. The Area is compact, contiguous and will constitute a separate commercial development within the Village of Algonquin; the Area will benefit specially from the special services to be provided and as hereinafter described; the proposed special services are in addition to municipal services provided to the Village of Algonquin as a whole; and it is therefore in the best interests of the Village that the levy of special taxes against the Area to finance the special services to be provided be considered. Such special services would include but not be limited to the following:
 - 1. maintenance, restoration, preservation and replanting of vegetation and landscaping within the Area as deemed necessary and appropriate by the Corporate Authorities; and
 - 2. maintenance, repair, restoration, dredging and removal of sediment or obstructions of and/or from any stormwater management, detention or retention area within the Area, as well as any cutting of grass or replanting of vegetation or landscaping within any of such areas within the Area as deemed necessary and appropriate by the Corporate Authorities; and
 - 3. maintenance, restoration, repair, replacement of any subdivision monument sign as well as vegetation and landscaping proximate to such sign within the Area or the 1st Resubdivision of North Point Algonquin Corporate Campus as deemed necessary and appropriate by the Corporate Authorities; and
 - 4. administrative, professionals', engineers', attorneys', consultants' and contractors' fees incurred by the Village relative to the provision of any of the above described special services as deemed appropriate by the Corporate Authorities (collectively, the "Special Services").

However, under no circumstances shall the provision of such Special Services by the Village or its contractors constitute an acceptance of any personal property or real property within the Area by the Village.

The term of the Special Service Area is perpetual, and the nature of the Special Services is new construction and/or maintenance within the Area.

If the Village receives funds as a result of providing the Special Services, such funds may be used by the Village itself to provide the Special Services or paid to a third party contractor to provide such Special Services on behalf of the Village.

- (a) The Village previously adopted Ordinance No. 2022-O-40 on October 4, 2022, proposing the establishment of a special service area for the Area. The establishment of Special Service Area No. 5 was considered at a public hearing held on December 6, 2022, in the Village of Algonquin Ganek Municipal Center, 2200 Harnish Drive, Algonquin, Illinois 60102 at 7:15 p.m. pursuant to notice duly published in the *Daily Herald* and in accordance with the Special Service Area Tax Law at least fifteen (15) days prior to the hearing, and also pursuant to notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, addressed to the person in whose name the general taxes for the last preceding year was paid on each lot, block, tract, parcel of land lying within the Special Service Area No. 5. A Certificate of Publication of Notice and an Affidavit of Mailing of Notice are attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit B and Exhibit C, respectively. Said notices conformed in all respects to the requirements of Section 27-25 of the Special Service Area Tax Law.
- (b) At the public hearing on December 6, 2022, all interested persons were given an opportunity to be heard on the questions of the creation of the special service area for the Area and the levy of special taxes against the Area to finance the Special Services, all as set forth in the notices.
- (c) After considering all information presented to the President and Board of Trustees and at the public hearing, as well as any and all information subsequently received up until today's date, the President and Board of Trustees hereby find that it is in the public interest and in the interest of the Village that the Village of Pingree Grove Special Service Area No. 5, as described herein, be established.
- (d) The territory within Special Service Area No. 5 is contiguous as required by the Special Service Area Tax Law.
- (e) An annual special tax shall be levied against each lot and each parcel in the Special Service Area as herein described which does not exceed the tax rate or method proposed in the notice of public hearing referred to herein and such special tax, taking into account the direct and indirect special service benefits to current and future owners of property within the Special Service Area, bears a rational relationship between the amount of tax levied against each lot, block, tract and parcel of land in the Special Service Area and the special service benefit conferred.
- (f) It is in the best interest of said Special Service Area that the furnishing of the special services proposed to be considered for the common interests of said Area, and that there be levied an annual special tax to pay the cost of the Special Services.
- (g) The properties within Special Service Area No. 5 will benefit specially from the Special Services.

However, prior to the Village providing any Special Services to the Area, the Village shall provide 15 days written notice to the registered agent of the Area's incorporated homeowners association of the Village's intention to provide the Special Services, unless, in the Village's reasonable determination, the Special Services need to be provided immediately because of an emergency. Unless there is an emergency, the homeowners association shall have 15 days from the date of the Village's notice regarding the work, repair, maintenance, restoration, replanting, landscaping, removal of dead landscaping, reconstruction, installation or grass cutting, maintenance, repair or replacement of the private drives, fence, berm, landscape easements, open spaces or common area within the Area, as the case may be, prior to the Village providing the Special Services to the Area. It is not the Village's intention to provide such Special Services and to adopt a tax levy against the Area unless there is a need to provide such Special Services and then only after providing notice to the registered agent of the Area's incorporated homeowners association as set forth above.

SECTION 3: **Special Service Area Levy**: The levy of an annual tax not to exceed the annual rate of .6 percent of the assessed value, as equalized, of the taxable property within the Area, shall be levied annually from the date of the establishment of the Special Service Area for the Area to pay for the Special Services to be provided. Said taxes shall be in addition to all other taxes provided by law and shall be levied pursuant to the provisions of the Special Service Area Tax Law. The amount of such tax levy for the Special Service Area for the initial year for which taxes will be levied within the special service area shall not exceed \$25,000 and shall not exceed the annual rate of .6 percent of the assessed value, as equalized, of the taxable property within the Area.

SECTION 4: **Effective Date:** No petition meeting the statutory requirements set forth in the Special Service Area Tax Law has been filed objecting to the creation of Special Service Area No. 5 or the levy or imposition of a special service area tax. As such, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage, approval, and publication in pamphlet manner form as provided by law. The Village Clerk is hereby directed and ordered to file a certified copy of this Ordinance with the Kane County Clerk and the Kane County Recorder, within sixty (60) days of the effective date hereof.

SECTION 5: If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, sentence or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged by any Court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair, invalidate or nullify the remainder thereof, which remainder shall remain and continue in full force and effect.

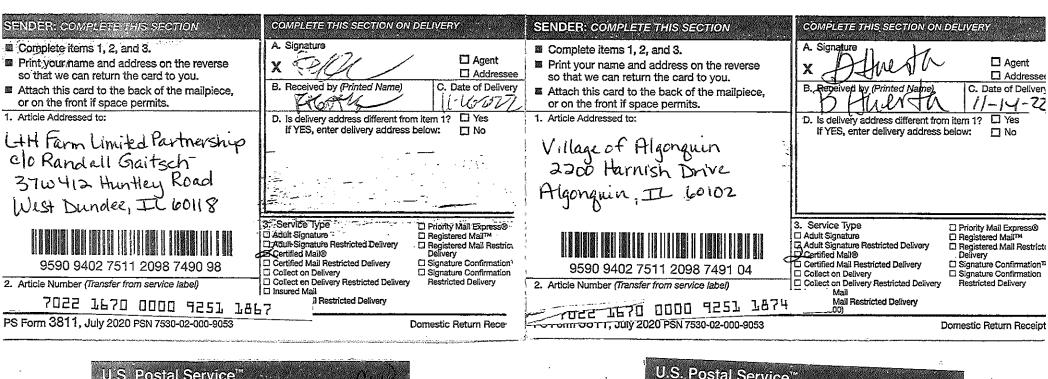
